AN ORDINANCE OF THE BETHEL CITY COUNCIL PROVIDING FOR A COMPLETE STREETS POLICY AND DIRECTING STAFF TO DEVELOP IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGIES TO INCREASE THE USABILITY OF ALL STREETS FOR ALL MODES OF TRAVEL FOR CITIZENS OF ALL AGES AND ABILITIES IN BETHEL

WHEREAS, The City of Bethel wishes to ensure that all users of our transportation system are able to travel safely and conveniently on all streets and roadways within the public right-of-way in Bethel; and

WHEREAS, a complete street is defined as one which provides a safe, convenient, and context-sensitive facility for all modes of travel, for users of all ages and all abilities; and

WHEREAS, complete streets better serve the needs of those who use transit by providing access to transit systems; and

WHEREAS, complete streets have public health benefits, such as encouraging physical activity and improving air quality, by providing the opportunity for more people to bike and walk safely; and

WHEREAS, complete streets improve access and safety for those who cannot or choose not to drive motor vehicles; and

WHEREAS, complete streets are essential in providing safe routes to school for children; and

WHEREAS, complete streets policies have been adopted legislatively by at least five states, and by at least 36 localities – of which 13 are by local law (resolutions or ordinances); and

WHEREAS, the City of Bethel currently has a limited complete streets policy; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City of Bethel to formalize a commitment to the principles of complete streets for all of our streets;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED, by the City Council of Bethel Alaska that the following changes are made to the Bethel Municipal Code Chapter 12.01 to create a Complete Streets Policy.

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Bethel Alaska as follows:

SECTION 1. Classification. This ordinance is of a permanent nature and shall become a part of the Bethel Municipal Code.

SECTION 2. Amending Section 12.01 of the Bethel Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows (new language is underlined).

Section 12.01 General Provisions

12.01.02 Application

- A. The provisions of this chapter will apply to the scoping, design, and construction of projects involving roadways in the City of Bethel.
- B. Any exception to applying these provisions to a specific roadway project must be approved by the City Council, with documentation of the reason for the exception.

12.01.03 Requirements

- A. Any roadway in the City of Bethel which is to be newly constructed or completely reconstructed must be designed and constructed to:
 1. Provide for the safety and convenience of all users of all ages and of all abilities: pedestrians, bicyclists, transit users, and motorists; and
 2. Address the needs of all users both along roadway corridors and crossing the corridors.
- B. Any project in which an existing roadway surface is to be restored or rehabilitated, and any remediation of deficient or non-existent sidewalks, shall be reviewed for the potential of making the roadway a complete street.

1. Consideration shall particularly include proportionality, the scope of work needed to make a complete street reasonable in relation to the scope of the proposed roadway construction, maintenance or improvement.
 2. The application of design standards will be flexible to permit context-sensitive design fitting the roadway design within the context of the neighborhood recognizing that all streets are different and user needs will be balanced.
- C. The Public Works and Planning Departments will review current design standards which apply to new roadway construction to assure that they reflect the best available design standards and guidelines, and effectively implement the Complete Streets Policy above stated.
- D. Design standards also serve as guidance for all existing roadway rehabilitation, reconstruction, or resurfacing, to the extent that the work required is reasonably proportional to the scale of the proposed rehabilitation, reconstruction, or resurfacing.

An annual report will be made to the City Council by the City Administration showing progress made in implementing this chapter.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This section shall become effective immediately June 1, 2013 upon the passage by the City Council.

WHEREAS, this draft assessment reviewed the submitted New Animal Drug Application for a genetically engineered (GE) Atlantic salmon species which was sponsored by AquaBounty Technologies;

WHEREAS, "AquaAdvantage" salmon, the fish proposed to be produced by AquaBounty Technologies, has a growth hormone that allows the fish to grow at a faster rate than that of non genetically modified salmon;

WHEREAS, the United States Food and Drug Administration is accepting comments until February 25, 2013 on the proposal to allow, for the first time, a genetically modified meat or fish product to be sold for human consumption;





Listed below are some of the action items and activities that I've been working on, and involved in, for the period January 29 – February 5, 2013

CITY ADMINISTRATION ACTION ITEMS AND ACTIVITIES

Projects:

- **YK Aquatic Center** - Regular weekly teleconference meetings between the Project Management Team and City Administration are held each Friday at 9:00 a.m. The following items are germane:
 1. I met with Ed Yarmack of Arctic Foundations to tour Anchorage facility and view construction of pilings. The operation is relatively small, but well organized and efficient. The production of our pilings for the Aquatic Center is steadily moving forward without any interruptions.
 2. The Special Inspections RFP was issued and three (3) responses were received. An evaluation team comprised of Doug Cobb, John Conway, Larry Elarton and Rachael Pitts will review the submissions, score the results, and select the company to perform the tests.
- **Tundra Ridge Road** – A videoconference was re- scheduled for January 29, or alternatively January 30, and I was scheduled to participate in that conference from Anchorage. However, this arrangement was cancelled for unknown reasons.

Miscellaneous:

- **YKHC** – For some time, YKHC has discussed wanting to get out of the water business and the Institutional Corridor is a viable vehicle to make that happen. However, the reality of the realignment of the Senate in Juneau is that it is extremely unlikely that the Institutional Corridor (IC) will move forward with State funding in the immediate future. I therefore met briefly with Greg McIntyre while in Anchorage and discussed the feasibility of connecting YKHC to the City's water sooner than later. Although everyone involved wants to proceed cautiously so as not to undercut any chance for funding for the IC, Greg is going to have YKHC's ANTHC designated engineer contact with CH2MHill engineers to establish a dialogue that explores a straight hook-up option along with the requirements for such a connection and its ramifications.
- **Old Armory** – The LKSD Board of Directors inquired if the City would take possession of the building and then turn it over to LKSD. After discussions with the City Attorney, I notified Superintendent Gary Baldwin that if the City took possession of the building in any manner whatsoever, and for whatever reason, we would become liable for operation, maintenance, and eventual demolition. While Gary did indicate that the LKSD Board might be willing to assume responsibility for the building, including demolition, I declined for legal reasons. LKSD will now contact the Department of Military and Veteran's Affairs and see if they would transfer the building to them directly.
- **Airport Master Plan** – This proposed plan was discussed at a meeting in Bethel on January 30. Unfortunately, the plan as envisioned will run a road directly through the newly created ATG Memorial Park and the recently opened Gun Range. It will also affect circulation to Kasayuli. Public comments are still being solicited and the Administration will be sending letters to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and DOT, requesting they reconsider their options.

Finance Committee

The Finance Committee met on January 24th achieving a quorum. The primary issue on the agenda was a discussion on the proposed sugar sweetened beverage tax. The committee voted unanimously against the proposed tax. The audited financial statements were presented and discussed briefly. Sadie Priem has been elected as the new Committee Chair with Clarke Davis being chosen as Vice Chair.

Staffing Issues/Concerns/Training

The Finance Department is currently fully staffed. One accounting clerk has submitted a resignation effective February 25, 2013.

Budget/Financial

As of December, 31 2012, the Finance Department had expended \$352,077 (46.8%) of its annual budget of \$752,617 with 50% of the year elapsed. The Utility Billing Department, which is also managed by the Finance, had expended \$74,557 (40.4%) of its annual budget of \$184,514.

Project Updates

- PERS Audit
The auditor completed the preliminary field work for the PERS audit. At this time we are awaiting additional questions from the state and the eventual draft of the audit.
- FY 2014 Annual Budget Preparation
Budget meetings were held throughout January with Administration, Finance, and Department Heads. The Finance Department is now in the process of preparing the proposed budget to be submitted to City Council by no later than April 1st.
- Online Bill Pay and Processing
During the month of March, Xpress Bill Pay will begin implementing an online bill pay function in coordination with Caselle, our accounting system. Customers will be notified with the April billing of the new system and given instructions on its use.

Planning Department Report

Date: February 1, 2013

The Planning Director has been working with Taunnie Boothby to prepare for a Floodplain Management and Mitigation Program compliance review for Bethel. This is a process that began with a visit from Taunnie in January. She is a Planner III with the State of Alaska. We are revising our paperwork to work with and inform all property owners who want to do development in the floodplain.

Dowl HKM held a public meeting on January 30th in Bethel to discuss the Bethel Airport Master Plan that is in progress. A lot of information was provided about airport needs and projects over the next 20 years. The plan will include expanding runways, increasing hangar space, and organizing the airport to better serve passengers. Runway expansion plans include an expansion of the crosswind runway, going west. Drawings are available at the Planning Department.

The planner attended a meeting at AVCP concerning the survey they planned to take about the homeless population in Bethel. They hope to identify numbers and other information to further discuss the need for some type of services, with focus on the dangers of sleeping in unheated structures.

Site Plan Permit Applications and Code Enforcement: We have issued two Site Permits to date.

We are planning a demolition of a shack identified by the Police Department as a public nuisance. This particular lot has junk cars and trash as well. This is where we had a death earlier in January. Property owners are being notified.

The Bethel Port:

Staff attended the Donlin Mine EIS Scoping. Many topics were covered and the meeting was well represented by native community members. Donlin plans to build a dock for ocean barge shipments that will be transported by river barge to the mine. The EIS process will take two years.

The planner is working with the Harbormaster concerning the Jung and Active parcels. The city would like to acquire easements along the river, and in the right-of-way. There is an ongoing discussion with BIA and property owners about the details.

Construction Projects:

Swimming Pool: Site development has begun and city staff members are providing information and feedback on access and other design elements. The first pilings will be put in this winter.

BNC Commercial Project (Kipusvik): Pilings are going in and construction will begin this winter. BNC has provided site plans and elevations that are available for view at the Planning Department.

Prematernal Home and Long Term Care Facility: A lot of progress has been made on the Pre-Maternal facility. The walls are up and the roof is being completed.

Street Improvements in Bethel: Attached to this report is information from DOT about planned street improvements in Bethel (DOT projects).

Opportunities: There may be a grant available to move a family in a flood prone home to a new home. If anyone can identify an appropriate property, possibly by the Slough, let the planner know.

January 2013 Monthly Report

Personnel:

Officer Turner has accepted another position in Colorado and we wish him the best of luck in his new position.

Officer Burkinshaw has returned to Utah due to family problems.

Trevor Waddell, CSP, has submitted his resignation to return to his families business in Kansas. We wish Trevor the best in his new endeavors.

During the hiring of Bobbio, CSO Chase expressed his desire to return to CSP due to dog issues. Bobbio has been assigned to the CSO position and Chase was transferred to CSP.

We have been actively recruiting for all positions and first round interviews are set for next week.

Operations:

Officers responded to 835 calls this month, 84 resulting in cases which resulted in 42 adult arrests and 0 juvenile arrests. Out of the 84 cases, 65 cases were cleared by arrest or in another manner (77.4%). Of note were:

- 17 assault calls were responded to.
- 3 Sexual Assaults
- 3 stolen vehicles
- 1 Burglaries were reported
- 8 (2 injury) total accidents.
- 3 animal attacks

Cases of note:

- On 1-26-2013 at approx. 1858 hrs, Officers responded to a report that a male had walked into the Longhouse and threatened the employees with a long gun. Officers arrived and located the individual later identified as Thomas Amik, 24yoa, of Bethel by 3rd and Main. On duty and Off duty Officers responded to both locations. Officer Turner was able to negotiate with Amik, and after a brief standoff, Amik was arrested without incident. Amik was in possession of a loaded "sawed" off shotgun. Amik was arrested for Assault and misconduct involving weapons among other pending charges. No alcohol suspected of being a factor. It was found that LongHouse employees had barricaded themselves inside a room when confronted by Amik.

Several complaints have been aired to council and on radio which we want to address:

1) Title 47 inebriate pickups

With regards to complaints regarding the CSP van's failure to pick up the "drunks" from a private residence, under Title 47.37.170 AS, Officers and CSP units are only allowed to pick up inebriates in a public place and are unable to enter a residence to remove inebriates. While this rule may have been loosely applied prior to the advent of the CSP unit, grant funding requirements mandate strict adherence to the law, hence possibly a change in the perception of how BPD used to do things.

Individual homeowners need to press charges on offending individuals who refuse to leave the residence once invited in. This is needed due to the fact that in Alaska, officers may not arrest for a misdemeanor not committed in their presence (limited exceptions). Therefore, you would need to be willing to press trespass, disturbing the peace or harassment charges, to name a few, on the individuals refusing to leave your residence to allow the officers to deal with the problem, within your residence, once they have been invited inside. Individuals who have entered without permission and committed a crime therein may be arrested for burglary, a felony, but the homeowner, while not the charging party would need to make a statement to that effect and would be a witness for the felony violation.

2) Officer Involved shooting report

BPD did not do the investigation on the officer involved shooting which occurred last year. Alaska Bureau of Investigation handled the investigation. The report is then submitted to the Attorney General's Office for review of charges. While it has been some time, investigations do not occur rapidly and the attorney's review will be thorough. We have no control over when the documents are completed and ready for release. ABI and BPD will have information available for release as soon as practical once the case review is completed.

Salmonberry is approx. 95% completed. Delays have occurred due to outside vendor equipment either not available or delayed. We expect the dispatch consoles somewhere around March 15th, once set by the vendor, ProComm can begin the dispatch move. IT requirements for phone, computer and other items are progressing well even with this delay as the other vendors are attempting to work around the issues.

Dispatch/Admin

Kajena handled 4 cab renewals, 2 new chauffeur licenses, 5 vehicle transfers, 10 Inspections, 1 chauffeur renewal this month.

Dispatch handled 1010 calls for service last month: AST 80, BFD 90, BPD 835, OCS 2, and Probation 1 and 2 taxi complaints.

CSP:

January totals- 52 males, 34 females, 41 residents, 43 nonresidents, 12 went to YKCC, 55 went to Sobering Center, 5 went to private residence, 11 ATCFS, 3 went to YKHC.

CSP officers were in EMT classes during part of January.

These figures do not reflect intoxicated persons contacted and placed by police personnel. CSP was in training for a week and officers placed PC's.

Animal Control:

The following are the dispositions of the animals impounded:

- 10 Returned to owner
- 9 Adopted
- 1 Euthanized
- 2 Dogs still impounded/quarantined
- 0 Cats still impounded

For those that don't know, **Bethel Friends of Canines** have been assisting us in placing dogs and they have developed contacts in sending adoptable dogs to Anchorage. We appreciate their help and we are currently working on volunteer programs which may benefit both groups.





Small Boat Harbor

- Dredging Project - on Jan 29th we had a teleconference with the COE Project Manager (PM) and the Quality Assurance Rep. We discussed the route for disposing the tailing and housing. There is still some details to work out between the COE and the contractor. The COE felt the contractor would be "breaking ice" Feb. 13th-15th 2013.

- G.O. Bonds - Jeamy Mason (CED) has no idea when these bonds will go up for sale or when they funds will be available. They city will probably have to administer the funds. The port was hoping that we could forward the funds to the Denali Commission so the COE could use the funds to stabilize the embankments around the SBH. The embankment stabilization has been put out to bid by the COE and the work would be a continuation of the current dredging project.

East Addition

- Bethel Bank Stabilization project – Active property – Actives have signed statements that they want to sell and agree to the sub-dividing their land. BIA is 30-60 days from approving the sub- division of the Active lots . It probably be one year till the BIA is ready to handle the City/Port purchasing the easements the Port/City needs.

- Jung Property – this property is a little behind in the process but Mr. Jung has been handed a copy of the sub-division and given a contact person at the BIA.

- Funding for this project is still a COE priority, it was number one two years ago. Because of the congressional budget process being in limbo the request for funds for this project hasn't gone away. Till the president signs a budget and officially cuts or approves the project project sits in limbo. I have requested written update from David Matinson of the COE. Verbally he encourages us to keep our Congressional legislators informed that we are still interested in completing this project.

Brown Slough

-Feb 4th mobbing to dry excavate Brown Slough will begin The Port and Public Works will work together to dig a channel too the bridge and remove obstructions at the mouth of Brown Slough.

City Dock

- East Timber Wall – contacted the Denali Commission on 31 Jan. 2013 and they are two weeks out, “Currently working on it.” from forwarding the award for design of the timber wall to the COE.
- Worked with the Grant Writer on the FY-14 legislative request for funding of this project along with funding for the sheet pile portion of the Dock.
- The ice road is opening up to transfer cargo to Old Kasigluk that is being stored on the Dock.
- Vitus Marine is working on boat for next season. They were told that no living aboard the boat was allowed.
- Camera was installed in a test location at the port office that allows us to cover the face of the dock and beach. We are working through some licensing and programming issues. We should be ready to install the rest of the cameras in the SBH this spring..
- The port is updating radios that need to be replaced and reprogrammed for narrow banding requirements
- Ports FY-14 budget submitted to finance department.
- Ports light plants were used in the Kuskokwim-300 along with free storage on the City Dock for straw for dogs.
- Crowley FUA was completed and forwarded to the Port Commission for review and recommendations.
- We have one person on vacation.
- Terrasond has forwarded the results on the hydro-survey that was completed this last summer there are no major changes to the river channel. The COE will also review the results.
- The gravel for the BATH Center is still secure at the Petro yard.
- Materials Safety Data Sheets were updated.

Programs/Divisions

Public Works Director:

What a change from last year the month of January has brought on for this year. This January has to be one of the mildest Januarys that I have experienced since I've been here in the last 38 years. It's been easier on the trucks and equipment all around as well as the fuel for the equipment and heating oil for all the buildings.

We are waiting for an Engineer's report on the Shop floor so we can put together a RFP on the Shop floor this month. So far the preliminary report isn't very good as most of the wood under the steel is rotten and is working into the glue laminated beams as well. The Engineers are looking at cement verses steel for structural integrity as well as a cost savings.

Two Streets and Roads personnel will be assisting the Port with digging out Brown's Slough this month. Pete is working out the details on this project.

59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 75.4% expended

Utility Maintenance:

This month we responded to five after hour callouts. We have Blue Tagged Non-payment accounts for our Billing Department. We also began monitoring our sewer lagoon raising one block to second containment. We also continue to thaw sewer lines as they freeze in ASHA. Our water plants continue to operate on a daily basis. We continue to rebuild sewer pumps when needed and monitor liftstations on a daily basis.

Piped Water: 59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 52.9% expended
Piped Sewer: 59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 54.9% expended
BHWTP: 59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 60.2% expended
CSWTP: 59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 51% expended
Sewer Lag: 59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 51.3% expended

Hauled Utilities:

Despite problems with attendance and trucks the routes are getting done. Been cutting down on overtime as much as we could but routes still need to get done. There are a couple of openings for drivers and there are a few applicants, but they are not what I am looking for.

Landfill Oper: 59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 73% expended
Hauled Water: 59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 52% expended
Hauled Sewer: 59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 46.1% expended
Hauled Refuse: 59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 43.9% expended

Property Maintenance:

Our winter schedule has been checking the buildings for heat and responding to areas the occupants say are cold or something unusual is going on with the plumbing or electrical. We do building checks seven days a week including Holidays. Along with that is the chore of snow removal and taking care of the icy spots. We have had a few call outs due to failures with alarm systems in a couple of our buildings one being our sprinkler system at Public Works. The Damper on the Fire Pump has to be replaced, it is old and to worn to salvage. I do have enough money to move around in this year's budget to pay for this expensive piece of equipment.

We have a few projects that we have been working on. We have been trying to increase/remedy the heat issue with the Fire Department. Its budget time as well and looking to get all my homework done and be prepared for next 12 months. One issue that continues to alarm me is having only one source of heat for our Court House. We used to be on waste heat from Bethel Utilities and the Heat Exchanger is still in place but nothing running through it. It would be nice to get a back up boiler in place if we can't resolve the issue with the Power Company. **The building is an important part of our Leased Properties and would be awful costly to come in to make repairs.** Thank you.

59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 53.1% expended

Road Maintenance:

Streets and Roads have been plowing and scari fying roads on an as needed basis. On this last thaw the State DOT helped Streets and Roads out with the sanding of the roads as our sander was broke down during the thaw. It is now running but this is the last winter on this sander truck do to it being worn out with cracks starting on the frame and it is rusting out from all the years of use.

Streets and Roads put in three helical piles in the ground with the 200 Hitachi backhoe at the new police station for Eddy Stanley, the electrician. We put two in between the new police station and the garage and the other we put in between the generator and the new police station. This is so that Eddy will have a good mount for the conduit to wire the generator to the police station and also the garage to the police station.

We have now started working on FY14 budget after the New Year and the FY14 Streets and Roads budget has been submitted to City Admin. I'm sure we will be working on it throughout the winter as is gets ironed out.

59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 49.4% expended

Vehicles and Equipment:

January has been a busy month, due to the extreme changes in weather. Repairs done were equipment related due to freezing temperatures: Frozen Brakes, Hose Reel Motors, Heaters and Blower Motors, Starters and Alternators. Above normal temps, assisting pulling vehicles stuck due to icy conditions. We worked on FY 14 Budget, requesting increase in funds to purchase a vehicle lift for the shop. This is needed, not only for Safety reasons, but also for efficiency. We have suggested to the Hauled Services department to review their drivers work schedules, to ensure all drivers are in and off the road in a timely manner. This will conserve on overtime, both for our department and theirs.

59% of the fiscal year has elapsed with 51.7% expended

Transit System:

The Bethel Transit System transported a total of 825 passengers, 101 of those riders had a disability and 97 were elders. The cash fares totaled \$853.00, while the passes used a total of \$518.00, monthly passes was \$246.00. There are three drivers; Brenda George who is the full time driver/Acting Manger; Rita Crook is a part time driver, and Jang Kim who is the On-Call driver. These figures are from January 1 thru the 30th 2013.
