Planning Department Report

Date: December 1, 2012

The Planning Director attended the AML / AKAPA Conference in Anchorage. She attended sessions on planning commission issues and public involvement techniques, among others. She also attended training at the Council Chambers to identify drug abuse in the workplace.

The Director has been working with the Parks Department to identify park needs and possible locations for new parks. We would like to ask for some state land that is north of Pinky's Park to do some expansion, along with other property.

The Director has been commissioned as a Notary Public, as part of a process to get easements from property owners for water and wastewater infrastructure.

Site Plan Permit Applications and Code Enforcement: We have issued 66 Site Permits to date.

We are working on the creation of a database of problem properties. We already have some data on properties that do not have city wastewater services. We are also working on specific complaints from residents.

Construction Projects:

Swimming Pool: The plat for the Aquatic Center was approved by City Council this month. A construction company has been selected to do the construction, Bethel Services Incorporated.

BNC Commercial Project (Kipusvik): Addresses have been assigned to the two retail segments of the development. They will be putting in pilings this winter.

Prematernal Home and Long Term Care Facility: A lot of progress has been made on the Pre-Maternal facility. The walls are up and the roof is being completed.

GIS: Now that the permitting has slowed down a little the Director is learning to use ArcMap, an ESRI program for mapping. There are some good shape files in our server for Bethel, and an updating of the map is a high priority. Our database includes aerials, and we will be determining how old they are. We currently have some maps that may be a bit out of date, including a bus route map. We need a zoning map, and hopefully we will have one in the new year.

Opportunities: There may be a grant available to move a family in a flood prone home to a new home. If anyone can identify an appropriate property, possibly by the Slough, let the Planner know.

- Explore funding options for the water front development.

November 2012 Monthly Report

Personnel:

CSP officers Wadell and Nelson are attending EMT training this month in addition to CSP duties.

Manny Bobbio has arrived in Bethel and begun his training program. Ed Chase requested a change to the CSP program so Bobbio is taking the CSO position.

We are still in the selection process for the open officer position.

Dispatchers Elarton and Hirsch are enrolled in the EMD course as we begin to transition to an EMD (Emergency Medical Dispatch) capability and have trainers here for EMD. Dispatch Supervisor Taylor is successfully completed the Dispatch Supervisor course.

Operations:

Officers responded to 831 calls this month, 96 resulting in cases which resulted in 50 adult arrests and 2 juveniles referred for prosecution. Out of the 96 cases, 79 cases were cleared by arrest or in another manner (82.3%). Of note were:

- 18 assault calls were responded to- 12 arrests.
- 3 Sexual Assaults- several still pending evaluation of charges.
- 2 Thefts- 1 arrests
- 1 Stolen Vehicles-1 arrest
- 6 DUI
- 0 Burglaries were reported
- 8 (5 injury) total accidents- 2 arrest.
- 3 Death investigations- investigation pending

Several noteworthy cases include:

- On 11-02-2012, Officer Limani and numerous officers responded to a multiple vehicle accident involving two vehicles and two pedestrians in front of the cultural center. The accident resulted in serious injuries to the pedestrians who were transported to YKHC and traffic was disrupted for approx an hour.
- On 11-18-2012, Officer Herrod responded to a loud party call and after subsequent investigation, Lindsey Smith, 20 yoa, was arrested for furnishing alcohol to a minor and MCA.

- On 11-5-2012, Officer Herrod responded to a vehicle accident and after investigation Leonty Myers JR, 23 yoa, was arrested for DUI and driving a stolen vehicle.
- On 11-10-2012, Officers responded to a suicidal male who had cut his wrist in Kaysauli. The subject ran to the tundra where the officers followed. Numerous officers responded. Officer Reid followed the subject approx. 6 miles on foot into the tundra. Search and Rescue was also notified. As the fog rolled in, the search was cancelled and we were unable to locate the subject. Officers continued to check the area and they contacted the subject in the early morning hours where he was taken to YKHC for evaluation.
- On 11-10-12, Officer Turner arrested Victor Bee, 33 yoa, after investigation of leaving the scene of an injury accident.
- On 11-15-2012, Officer Turner and Sgt. Salyers responded to Salmonberry/State Hwy area for a report of an unresponsive juvenile. The death of the 17 yoa juvenile female is being investigated and we are currently waiting for lab results from the State Medical Examiner's Office.
- On 11-18-2012, Officer Herrod arrested Maurice Pete, 25yoa, in Trailer Court after investigation that he stabbed a 24 yoa male at that location.
- On 11-21-2012, Officers responded to Larson subdivision for an unresponsive female in the arctic way of a residence. Minnie Lake, 43 yoa, was transported to YKHC where she later passed away.
- On 11-30-2012, Officer Davis responded to a report of a gunshot victim. Officer Davis that Alexander Oscar, 24 yoa, deceased from an apparent self inflicted gunshot wound.

The police building construction is moving along. Sheet rock is completed, painted and flooring is being installed along with cabinets and countertops. The generator has been delayed and with our dispatch furniture also delayed our opening date is undetermined at this point.. The contractors have been working around these problems as best they can but some infrastructure cannot be completed until completion of base items.

We met with all cab companies, with the exception of Qu yana who did not send a representative, concerning issues regarding drivers and dispatching. We have had several cab drivers attempting to dispatch via the cell phone and car radio and due to the lack of attention or ability to multitask have driven into the wrong lane of traffic. On three occasions the drivers have driven oncoming traffic off the road as the cab was totally into the oncoming lane. One driver (Qu yana Cab) has two pending citations for that offense and is currently suspended pending investigation of possible revocation of his license. The owners and staff talked about the current proposal in PSTC to go back to a fixed dispatch center to avoid this serious hazard. The owners present agreed to support a no cell phone use policy while a cab is in motion in an attempt to ensure the safety of passengers. Additionally they will ensure that only senior drivers capable of dispatching and driving would have that assignment. We also discussed the requirement for logging calls per the BMC and that requirement will be mandated with submission at the first of the year. Alaska Cab is recording their information so we are receiving their calls on CD.

This is important for numerous reasons, most recently, our cab murder and a serious assault call where cabs were involved and there was no record available. We appreciate the cab owners, who were present, working with us to address these issues and it was apparent that they were also concerned for the safety of the public and their drivers. We are also working with two cab companies which were found to have scanning capability in their radios after a competing cab driver responded on a different channel. We expect to have that issue resolved by the first of January.

Dispatch/Admin

Jena Baty handled 0 cab renewals, 3 new chauffeur licenses, 3 vehicle transfers, 0 permit renewals, 0 temporary permit, 0 revocations and 10 inspections this month. We have handled numerous cab complaints and officers have written several citations and we have had meetings with the owners and drivers to discuss these continued safety violations. Of major note were that two dispatch cabs drove into oncoming traffic, one fully across the road due to their inability to multitask the driving, cell phone and radio. We will be discussing remedies with the PSTC this month.

Dispatch handled 1007 calls for service last month: AST 73, BFD 98, BPD 831, OCS 2, and Probation 0, Taxi Complaints 2 (new category we are instituting).

Programs/Divisions

Public Works Director:

I've been working with John Sargent, Clair Grifka, and Bill Arnold on the shop floor RFP. We will bring in an engineer to verify all the weight that will be added to the floor as well as the integrity of the piling and gluelam beams the floor sets on. We will be staging the repairs to cover two summers so we will not be interfering with the mechanics and their work.

There wasn't enough money to ship all the new trucks that was purchased from Kendall Ford this spring on the airlines like I thought I could. They are going to come in this spring on the barge.

Utility Maintenance:

This month we responded to six callouts. We also helped with Blue Tags for billing. We also helped with voting polls. We also had couple water lines broke in our BHWTP. We also had one residential hook up. We also had one sewer line freeze up in ASHA. We also continue to rebuild sewer pumps when needed and monitor our lift stations on a daily basis. Our water plant also operates daily.

Hauled Utilities:

The driver's have been busy working into the evenings getting routes and extra's done. Two of the three new drivers' are now doing routes of their own. They've been doing pretty good. A couple of houses have been flooded due to frozen overflows and scheduling mistakes. I've been telling

the water drivers to tag houses that have frozen overflows and fills. Hopefully attendance will improve once everyone is done going a flu that has been going around. Drivers have been doing good not getting stuck and hope it stays that way.

Property Maintenance:

This department has been busy performing daily maintenance on all our buildings and grounds. We check for heat, plumbing, lighting and correct any issues associated with this. With all the ice this year we have been spreading lots of salt/sand around stairs and entrance ways. We brought out Pioneer Door to repair a problem with an overhead door at the shop and service others that we had here and our other buildings. There is a Forty Hour Hazwhopper class that we are getting some training for dealing with oil spills.

I have been looking ahead toward budget time to address some issues that we will need to take care of in re-guards to soil remediation and projects and building issues. The steel clad panels on the City Shop are deteriorating from rust and we will probably have to look at installing new siding on whole sections or sides of the Facility. It seems limited to the south and east walls along the whole length of the building.

Road Maintenance:

Streets and Road has been sanding and scarifying the roads as needed since the thaw. This thaw seems to be the worst that we've had in a few years with freezing rain that lasted for over a day. We could not keep up with the slippery roads with the sander until it stops raining. With the freezing rain it would be just as slippery as it was before we sanded in a matter of minutes. It took over a day when the rain quit before we could get a handle on the slippery roads by sanding and scarifying the roads.

Streets and Roads is done with hauling sand to the land fill for cover this winter, from the city sand pit, now that the sand is froze up. We did manage to stock pile a small pile of sand for this winter and to cover a large area at the land fill.

Streets and Roads are now just starting to cross H-Marker Lake with heavy equipment now that we have 2 feet of ice. We scarified the ice crossing H-Marker Lake and smoothed it up with the grader. The rough ice was

caused by the vehicles diving across the lake during the thaw. During the thaw H-Marker Lake water did overflow over the ice road on the H-Marker road side of the lake a little over a foot. During that time cars still drove over it and when it started to freeze they were getting stuck in the over flow even when we put road close signs up with cones on both ends they would drive around them or over them just to cross the lake.

Vehicles and Equipment:

We have a new Mechanic starting on the first of December. Thanks to Vince Devlin working with his drivers we are seeing less trucks in the shop as of recently. Giving us more time to work on other projects.

Transit System:

Good evening everyone, I would like to first introduce myself, I am Stan Okpealuk Sr. I am an Inupiat from the Northwest Region. I have run a large Transit Division in the past, and it was very successful. A couple of weeks ago I had been hired on as your Transit Manager. I have never been to your village before, this is my first time I have ever set foot here and I am amazed at how your village is run, and the people are delightfully kind and helpful and generous if I am add. I feel very welcome here. I would like to thank-you very much for this opportunity to be a member of your community.

The month of November showed a total of 751 riders, I am sure if we had numbers for the holidays the ridership totals would be considerably higher. Of the 751 riders 97 were disabled riders and 68 were among the elder population. Considering the cuts in the daily route schedule and the number of holidays in this month, the total number of riders, are quite favorable and shows that the members of this community are choosing a more affordable mode of Public transportation over the more expensive competitive source that is quite noticeably abundant within this community. Also during the two weeks of this month that I have so far been here we have had two vehicles forwarded to the repair shop for diagnose and repairs. Our professional repair technicians have completed diagnosing both vehicles and have repaired one vehicle and we have placed that back in operation, just this morning I had been informed by the shops foreman

that parts for the second vehicle have arrived and that the vehicle would possibly been worked on this coming weekend provided that other prioritized work are not forthcoming.

Just within this short period of time that I have been here, your grants dept and I have been putting in an enormous amount of effort in finding addition sources of funding to either expand this operation or to revert back to a full scale operation as it was prior to the cuts that were introduced.

In addition I am currently looking into reducing the amount of certain expenditures by going to another source or supplier of certain items that are at the moment quite costly to the Transit system and that have used up parts of the budget quite rapidly.

Also the source of additional monthly revenue beside the fares from the private sector are being looked at and may also be added, of course this would all come from the private sector which would increase their business and our ridership if it were successfully implemented and carried on at a monthly basis.

I personally have always been in favor of employing as many people in a community as possible; expanding the Public Transit System would be very helpful in employing members of this community which in turn would help the current and future local businesses. It would also provide an affordable mode of transportation to the population.

And I would like to commend our only two dedicated drivers that we currently have, Mrs. Brenda George and Mrs. Rita Crook, they both are very helpful, and show a very strong desire to keep this operation going successfully and are keen to what the public wants and comprehends in their own way, the need for affordable transportation for all members of this community.



SUBJECT: Manager's Report – Month of November 2012

Programs/Divisions

- All vehicles are up and running with the exception of the 1972 Engine-2 which has serious problems with its Cummins Diesel engine.
- Captain Howell is working with Grants Manager John Sargent with regards to the specifications and procedures involved in the purchase of a new fire engine with grant monies from the State of Alaska. This fire engine will be the replacement for the one mentioned in the previous chapter. We are anticipating barge delivery mid to late summer. Fire engine chassis are backlogged and there are many engine orders in the United States as a result of local and Federal funding sources. We have applied to the feds for funding for a water tanker/pumper for the department also.

Staffing Issues/Concerns/Training

- We are still recruiting for one vacant Firefighter / EMT positions. We are reviewing the applications of four qualified persons. I have been forced to consider applications from people outside of Bethel as we have no local applicants for the position. This is a frustrating situation for me as I prefer to always hire from our volunteer ranks or from the community. We offer free State of Alaska accredited EMT-I and Firefighter classes to anyone who will simply agree to volunteer with us after completion of class. The costs of these classes can run a person thousands of dollars apiece if taken at a commercial school or hundreds of dollars and a full semester of college if taken locally, when they are offered. We have on-site instructors, a classroom and excellent training aids.
- We are as prepared for winter with regards to the building and the vehicles as we can be. We are currently dealing with a major freeze-up of our apparatus floor as a result of several items that have still not been addressed by our contractor.
- An EMT meeting was held on November 20 in the evening at the Fire Station. A review of recent ambulance runs was conducted followed by training in burns.

Reviewed the “rule of nines”, “rule of palms” and review of standing orders for burns and review of the Parkland burn formula.

- An EMT meeting was held on November 6 in the evening at the Fire Station. Training for the evening consisted of training in unconscious unresponsive patients.
- A Fire meeting was held on November 8 in the evening at the Fire Station. A review of recent fire calls was conducted followed by training in ropes, knots, hoisting of ladders. Fire meeting for November 22 was cancelled for Thanksgiving.
- The next fire training meeting is scheduled for December 13 in the evening at the fire station.
- EMT instructor Fred Watson is finishing up our latest EMT-I class with final testing to happen this Saturday. We have nine students left out of the original fifteen that started. Best of luck to all the students.

Budget/Financial

- The department is operating within its allocated budget.

LED Streetlights

All LED streetlights ordered thus far have been installed. The City added at least twenty new lights to brighten up certain areas of town. In addition to four new streetlights being added to Ridgecrest Drive, several new ones were added on Ptarmigan Street, near Tundra Ridge subdivision. The next order of about 30 LED streetlights will arrive by barge and be installed next summer.

USDA Construction Grant

The City of Bethel completed the final close-out report required by USDA-RD to close out the City’s construction grant. All of the City’s work was completed per the scope of work delineated in the grant agreement. This grant is expected to be closed within 30 days.

USDA Preconstruction Grant

I have been working to furnish Larsen Consulting Group with bits and pieces of information and documents so that they can complete the Preliminary Engineering Report and Engineering Report (PER/ER) for the A,B, C Loop Renovation project for Bethel Heights and the Sewage Lagoon project upgrades. Thus far, USDA has not approved either of the two versions of the PER/ER submitted. The PER/ER for the manhole reconstruction project has been approved.

Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant

I am working with the Parks and Recreation Department and Planner to prepare a Land and Water Conservation Fund grant application to fund Pinky’s Park upgrades. A resolution outlining the proposal will be submitted to Bethel City Council for consideration at the first meeting in January 2013.

Finance Committee

The Finance Committee did not achieve a quorum for its meeting on November 29, 2012. The next regularly scheduled meeting of the committee is set for Thursday, January 24, 2012.

Staffing Issues/Concerns/Training

The Finance Department is currently fully staffed. We are currently focusing on cross-training certain staff members for other work functions within the department but outside their normal work areas.

Budget/Financial

As of October 31, 2012, the Finance Department had expended \$218,071 (29%) of its annual budget of \$752,617 with 25% of the year elapsed. The Utility Billing Department, which is also managed by the Finance, had expended \$50,075 (27%) of its annual budget of \$184,514.

Project Updates

- Sales Tax Audits

The Finance Department is making plans to conduct a round of sales tax audits during January or February. We expect to conduct a total of 10 business audits during this timeframe.

We continue to work with businesses which were audited during the June audit to collect monies owed to the City. These balances are being tracked and the Finance Department fully intends to collect them in as timely of manner as is possible.

- Online Bill Payment System

We are excited to announce that the Finance Department is moving forward with implementation of the new online bill payment system through Xpress Bill Pay. A member of staff from Xpress Bill Pay is planning to be onsite in Bethel during January for implementation and training of staff. Customers should be able to start using the new feature by no later than February. We expect to announce in the local newspapers and provide a link on the City's Website.

- PERS Audit
We have been informed by the State of Alaska Public Retirement System of an audit of the City of Bethel's records during the month of January. It is our understanding that PERS is increasing the number of audits in the state during the next year.
- FY 2014 Annual Budget Preparation
The Finance Department is beginning preparations for the FY 2014 Budget season. We expect budget worksheets to be sent to departments by the end of December. Administration, Finance and department heads expect to meet in late January to mid February. Submission of the proposed budget to City Council is due by April 1st.
