The United Utilities Company employees gave a presentation about the proposed cell tower located in the Tundra Ridge subdivision.

Also, the Tundra Ridge covenants state that the Tundra Ridge neighborhood is strictly residential. **Citizen Tim Bee** voiced his concerns about living next door to a cell tower, specifically how it would effect his DISH Satellite television reception, and did not like the cell tower going in at a residential location. **Citizen Joanne Neck** stated she was not worried.



Ordinance #13-14

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE OFFICIAL CITY LAND USE MAP DATED JULY 10, 1990 PURSUANT TO SECTION 18.76 OF THE BETHEL MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission has approved the zoning on May 9, 2013, of certain lands belonging to the heirs of Nicholas Charles, F-14838-A2, 50-81-0029;

WHEREAS; the Planning Director/Platting Officer for the City of Bethel has determined that this zoning conforms to City Code, pursuant to BMC 18.76, and is compatible with the Bethel Comprehensive Plan, and recommends that the zoning be approved;

WHEREAS; Section 18.76 of the Bethel Municipal Code provides that such rezoning is accomplished through an amendment to the official land use map of the City enacted by an ordinance;

WHEREAS The City Council finds that such redistricting is in the public interest; and

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Bethel, Alaska, that:

SECTION 1. Classification. This ordinance is not permanent in nature and shall not be placed in the Bethel Municipal Code.

SECTION 2. Amendment. The City of Bethel Official City Zoning Map dated July 10, 1990 is hereby amended.

Pursuant to Section 18.76 of the Bethel Municipal Code, the Official Land Use Map dated July 10, 1990, is amended as follows: THE CHARLES PROPERTY, PROPOSED SNOWRIDGE SUBDIVISION, ON 150.42 ACRES, is hereby rezoned from General Use, Preservation, and no designated zoning district, to Residential and Preservation.

SECTION 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon recording of the final plat for each added development in the subdivision.



Comprehensive Plan Conformity		
Street Status	The primary access to the parcel is Tundra Ridge Road. This is a state road that will be improved in the next few years as part of the STIP (No. 2231).	
<i>Goal 4: Encourage a range of housing opportunities for current and future Bethel residents, including more housing within the purchasing or rental capabilities of young families, single people, school teachers and other workers.</i>		
Residential land uses at this location will provide opportunities for new housing to purchase or rent. Taking into account the growth of facilities and population in Bethel in the last few years, it is more important than ever to plan for new housing stock. More housing at this location will be compatible with other land uses in the area.		
<i>Goal 6: Maintain and protect the quality of the water, land, and biological resources within the city; encourage the sustainable use of those resources for current and future generations.</i>		
Preservation zoning is used to protect wetlands from inappropriate development. The City of Bethel works with the Army Corps of Engineers to preserve these areas, which are also a part of the Yukon Delta National Wildlife Refuge. Every year migratory birds come to the Bethel area for nesting purposes.

Background, Issues, and Analysis

This request for Residential zoning is compatible with other land uses in the area. Residential zoning and / or land uses exist to the north in the Tundra Ridge subdivision. The parcel is located north of the Bethel Airport, but far enough away to minimize noise impacts. The State of Alaska is currently in a planning process for airport expansion over the next twenty years, and current maps show that expansion is planned to extend west of the airport.

There is a need for residential land development in Bethel. The residential shortage contributes to high land and rent costs. Bethel has been growing, and more housing will contribute to the quality of life in the city.

The parcel is located on the west side of Bethel, outside of the areas FEMA identifies as floodplain. There are some wetland areas that are exempt from the General Permit for the Discharge of Dredged and/or Fill Material into Wetlands at Bethel. These areas are indicated on the proposed zoning map as Preservation areas. (Permit SPN-2011-124.)

Residential zoning also permits Planned Unit Developments as conditional uses, offering the potential for a variety of development projects. Planned Unit Developments can offer opportunities to plan for future land uses and traffic circulation.

The road that passes through the Charles property is an important part of city traffic circulation. It was part of the Interim Conveyance by the Kuskokwim Corporation, in the Kuskokwim Recording District, in 1983 (Book 17, Page 99). The extension from the Ptarmigan corridor includes two road segments (16 and 16a, C4) that extend to the BIA Road, and a one acre site easement that allows parking, temporary camping, and loading and unloading. The southern extension to BIA Road has been closed by allotment holders, and alternative traffic circulation corridors are being sought by the city.

Findings

1. The request for Residential zoning (with areas designated for Preservation) is compatible with the Bethel Comprehensive Plan.
2. New housing stock in Bethel will contribute to community welfare and amenities.
3. The location of housing at this location will not interfere with any current airport expansion plans.
4. The parcel is not located in an area identified at this time as floodplain by FEMA.

Stipulations

1. Site Plan Permits must be obtained from the Bethel Planning Department for fill, and construction.
2. The platting, permitting, and construction processes must conform to the City of Bethel Municipal Code, and any and all requirements of the State Fire Marshall must be met.
3. At the time piped water and sewer services are provided to the area, property owners are required to hook up to these services. Until that time properties must provide sufficient clearance for water and wastewater trucks to access the residences.
4. The subdivision must provide dedicated areas for location of neighborhood dumpsters.
5. The Planning Department will assign street numbers to individual properties, and these must be visible from the street.
6. No fill is permitted in preservation areas, to include private property.




Charles Property Current Zoning

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING BETHEL MUNICIPAL CODE BY INSERTING CHAPTER 9.33 TITLED SILLY STRING AND PRACTICAL JOKE ITEMS PROHIBITED

WHEREAS, every year the City of Bethel hosts a Fourth of July Festival which brings hundreds of people to the Pinky's Park area;

WHEREAS, during this festival a number of vendors sell practical joke items such as fart bags and fart spray that become a nuisance to the festival goers;

WHEREAS, vendors also sell aerosol cans filled with a foam like substance commonly known as "silly string" which becomes a nuisance;

WHEREAS, vendors also sell aerosol cans filled with temporary hair color which is not permanent to hair but is permanent to wood and clothing, vandalism by this product has required costly repairs to buildings in the area of the celebration,

WHEREAS, young adults and children run through the park spraying each other or setting off these nuisance items, while not paying to attention to the many others surrounding them;

WHEREAS, not only is the use of these products a nuisance during the celebration, the cleanup following the festivities has proven to be extensive due to the number of areole cans and "silly string" found throughout the area;

WHEREAS, the use of these products interferes with the peaceful enjoyment of the Fourth of July Celebration which is a public event;

WHEREAS by banning the sale and use of these products shortly before, during and shortly after the celebration, the spectators as well as volunteers and staff can attend the celebration without the nuisances of products specifically produced for pranks and irritations;

WHEREAS, the festival space, both in park areas and residential areas that surround the park, will be substantially easier to clean following the close of the celebration

9.33.010 Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

"Fart Spray" or "Fart Bag/Bomb" means any product specifically produced to sound and/or smell like fart and fecal matter.

"Hair Color Spray" means a temporary aerosol spray of hair color that washes out.

"Park" means any area in the City of Bethel dedicated as a public park or used for park, recreation or conservation purposes.

"Party Poppers" means a small plastic cylinder which, when a string is pulled, makes a small bang and fires thin paper streamers into the air.

"Walkways" means the area within the public right-of-way adjoining streets in the City of Bethel.

"Silly String" means A foam like substance which is shot and/or propelled by use of an aerosol can and/or similar dispenser and which, when so shot/propelled, emerges from said can/dispenser in a string-like form, the same being sold under the product name of "Silly String" and/or other products.

"Streets" means any street laid out and used as a public thoroughfare in the City of Bethel.

No person, including any individual or entity, shall sell products called "silly string", "fart bags/bomb", "fart spray", "party popper" and "hair color spray" in or along the public streets, walkways, parks, public places or from any business conducted in the City of Bethel from June 15 to July 15.

9.33.030 Violations and penalties.

A violation of this chapter shall subject the violator to the penalties provided under chapter 1.08, General Penalties, of the BMC.

SECTION 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon the passage by the City Council.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BETHEL MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 5.40 CHAUFFEURS, CELL PHONE USE PROHIBITED

WHEREAS, operating a motor vehicle is a multi-task function and dispatching via radio and telephone complicates and distracts from the safe and professional operation of a "for hire" commercial vehicle.

WHEREAS, using a cell-phone while operating a taxicab has proven to be distracting to chauffeurs and therefore dangerous to the public.

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska and the US Department of Transportation have enacted rules and regulations regarding cell phones and other devices which distract drivers in an effort to promote traffic safety for commercial drivers and the public.

WHEREAS, prohibiting the use of cell-phones by chauffeurs would increase safe driving practices and prevent dangerous driving action.

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Bethel, Alaska, that:

SECTION 1. Classification. This ordinance is of permanent nature and shall be codified within the Bethel Municipal Code.

SECTION 2. Amendment. Section 5.40 of the Bethel Municipal Code Chauffeurs is amended as follows (new language is underlined and old language is stricken out).

CHAPTER 5.40 CHAUFFEURS

5.40.110 Two-way radio prohibited.

No chauffeur may possess in a taxicab or allow another to operate a scanner capable of monitoring a frequency used by a dispatch service other than that used by the taxicab's dispatch service.

 3. Chauffeur's permit is susceptible to revocation for the third (3rd) offense.

Each chauffeur of a taxicab must check in with the dispatch service engaged by the permittee when the chauffeur begins a work shift and check out when the chauffeur departs a work shift.

It must be assessed separately, listed separately on the citation and on the judgment, and receipted using a separate accounting code.

The surcharge is mandatory. It may not be waived, deferred or suspended. However, a judge may allow a defendant who is unable to pay the surcharge to perform community work service under AS 12.55.055(c) in lieu of the surcharge.

In imposing the fine, the court may not reduce the fine by the amount of the surcharge or otherwise consider the applicability of a surcharge to the offense. AS 12.55.035(f).

10.01.050 Applicability of Traffic Regulations to Public Employees

The provisions of this title shall apply to the drivers of all vehicles owned or operated by the United States, the State or any borough, town, district or any other political subdivision of the State, subject to the specific exemptions as are set forth in this title or the state Vehicle Code.

10.01.060 Disposition of Citation

A. Optional Court Appearance:

1. A defendant charged with a minor offense for which a bail forfeiture amount has been established must within 30 days after the citation was issued:

(a) appear for arraignment at the time and place indicated on the citation. Arraignment must be conducted in accordance with District Court Criminal Rule 1; or

(b) enter a plea of not guilty and request trial by mailing or delivering a signed plea as directed on the citation; or

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(c) enter a plea of no contest and submit payment of the citation, plus any surcharge established by statute, as directed on the citation; or

(d) provide proof of compliance to a law enforcement agency if a statute, regulation, or ordinance permits dismissal of the citation upon a showing of compliance, except that proof of compliance also may be made to the court for violation of AS 28.15.131 (failure to carry or exhibit license) or AS 28.22.019 (proof of insurance). The court or municipality shall dismiss the citation upon notification from the agency or proof of compliance.

2. A defendant who mails or delivers an unsigned copy of the citation with the defendant's payment will be deemed to have entered a plea of no contest unless the defendant designates otherwise.

B. Mandatory Court Appearance. A defendant charged with a minor offense for which no bail forfeiture amount has been must:

1. Appear for arraignment at the time and place indicated on the citation or summons. Arraignment must be conducted in accordance with District Court Criminal Rule 1; or

2. Provide proof of compliance to a law enforcement agency if a statute, regulation, or ordinance permits dismissal of the citation upon a showing of compliance. The court or municipality shall dismiss the citation upon notification from the agency.

10.01.070 Failure to Respond or to Appear.

A. Failure to Respond to Citation.

1. *Default Judgment.* If a defendant fails to respond as provided in 10.01.060, the court may, without finding probable cause to believe the defendant committed the offense, enter a default judgment of conviction as provided in 10.01.080.

2. *Warning Notice Requirement.* At least 15 days before default judgment is entered, a notice advising the defendant of the consequences of a failure to respond must be sent to the defendant at the address on record with the Division of Motor Vehicles or the address shown on the citation.

3. *Citations Filed With Municipalities.* If the citation is initially filed with the City, as authorized by Alaska Court System Administrative Bulletin 39, the City may request a default judgment by filing with the court the citation and an affidavit from a City employee stating that the City sent the defendant the warning notice required in 2. above and the defendant failed to respond. Requests for default judgment must be filed within six months after the citation was issued.

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B. Failure to Appear After Summons. If a defendant who has been served a summons fails to appear, the court may enter a default judgment of conviction as provided in 10.01.080.

C. Failure to Appear for Trial. If a defendant has been sent notice of a trial date and then fails to appear on the scheduled date, the court may, without finding probable cause to believe the defendant committed the offense, enter a default judgment of conviction as provided in 10.01.080. The notice of a trial date must advise the defendant of the consequences if the defendant fails to appear.

10.01.080 Judgment, Costs, Fees, and Relief from Default Judgment.

A. Fine. A judgment of conviction must order payment of the fine as follows:

1. After Plea or Trial.

(a) Pursuant to AS 12.25.230(c), the fine may not exceed the amount listed on the bail forfeiture or fine schedule.

(b) The City prohibits a reduction from the scheduled fine amount absent the City's express consent.

(c) For offenses that require a mandatory court appearance, the court may impose a fine up to the maximum authorized by statute or ordinance.

B. Default Judgment. A default judgment entered under 10.01.070 must require the defendant to pay the scheduled bail or fine amount if the offense is an optional court appearance offense or the maximum penalty if the offense is a mandatory court appearance offense.

10.01.090 Defendant under Eighteen

A defendant under 18 years of age at the time of the offense must be accompanied by a parent, guardian, or legal custodian at any court appearance for a minor offense until the defendant reaches age 18.

10.01.100 Forfeiture

A. A default judgment or a judgment entered on a no contest plea must order forfeiture of any seized items listed on the citation or other charging document.

1. All other judgments of conviction must order forfeiture of:

(a) Any seized items listed on the citation or other charging document if a statute or ordinance requires the item to be forfeited upon conviction, and

(b) Any other items ordered by the court to be forfeited when forfeiture is authorized by statute or ordinance.

B. Forfeited items shall be disposed of at the discretion of the prosecuting authority, unless otherwise ordered by the court.

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SECTION 3. Effective Date. This section shall become effective immediately upon the passage by the City Council.

Listed below is an explanation for the budget modification requested in Ordinance #12-06(c)

The enclosed Ordinance 12-06(c) requests approval from City Council to transfer budgeted amounts within line items to cover necessary expenditures which have arisen during the fiscal year. Most of the expenditures were the result of necessary operational activities of the City. The costs of this modification are covered by both higher than expected revenues and budget reductions if other expenditure line items with the exception of two areas listed below.

A request of an additional appropriation of \$59,902 in the General Fund was necessary due to an invoice received from the State of Alaska from a utility relocation which occurred in 2008 and was authorized by a prior administration. The City recently became aware of this final billing for the project. After consulting the City Attorney, it has been determined that the invoice must be paid. We are awaiting Council approval before remitting funds to the State. We request an appropriation from current year budgeted surplus to cover the costs.

Administration also requests an appropriation of \$47,400 from current year budgeted surplus in the Solid Waste Fund to cover cost overruns in Landfill Operations. We covered a portion of these unavoidable costs through other line item reductions but were not able to cover the entire amount through reductions. The Solid Waste Fund has more than sufficient surpluses to cover these costs. We can provide additional details at the Council meeting upon request.

Two other major items were covered in this budget modification. One was a cost overrun in the Fire Station Capital Project Fund of \$38,500. The other was additional funds needed in the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund of \$82,587. Both of these transfers were fully funded

by reductions in other areas.

This budget modification will be the final one presented for FY 2013. Should you have questions, please feel free to contact me.

I will be available at the Council meeting to discuss the details of Ordinance 12-06(b). Should you have any questions regarding any of the information provided, please let me know.

Listed below is an explanation for the budget modification requested in 13-12 (a).

The enclosed Ordinance 13-12 (a) if passed will authorize a modification of the FY 2014 Budget for the City of Bethel. The intent of this ordinance is to establish a use for the newly imposed tobacco excise tax.

With \$70,681.52 received after two months of tobacco excise tax submissions, the City can estimate an increase to the General Fund balance of over \$300,000 for the FY 2014 Budget. The increase to the General Fund balance from the excise tax submission was not identified in the passage of the operating budget, Ordinance 13-12, because of lack of data at the time of passage.

To help insure suitable use of the funds, the Council must find designations that will benefit the community, but will not become reliant on the funds, which may not be a dependable source of revenue.

Beginning with an estimated \$300,000 in fund balance, the budget modification allocates the following:

- \$10,000 to a community dog park.
- \$50,000 to the Senior Center which was allocated in the City's original budget and not identified specifically in this Ordinance.
- The remaining amount is broken up into three parts:
 - 25% Parks and Recreation (Account Number 2650690 City Park Development at \$40,000 and Account Number 1071775 Recreational Activities at \$20,000)
 - 25% Bike/Walking Paths (Account Number 2650694 \$60,000)
 - 50% General Fund (\$120,000)

Listed below are some of the action items and activities that I've been working on, and involved in, for the period May 21 – June 4, 2013.

CITY ADMINISTRATION ACTION ITEMS AND ACTIVITIES

Projects:

- **YK Aquatic Center** - Regular weekly teleconference meetings between the Project Management Team and City Administration are held each Friday at 9:00 a.m. The following items are germane:
 1. The first BSI barge is currently scheduled to arrive in Bethel on June 17. Ice blockage on both sides of Eek Island has the potential to delay this arrival.
 2. ProDev's Martha Schoenthal is working closely with the City's Grant Manager to compile an FFE (fixtures, furnishings, & equipment) list. Port Director Pete Williams will work with vendors and carriers to budget FFE freight costs.
 3. A cooperative effort by all stakeholders has resulted in reduced costs to construct the Fire Access Road around the Aquatic Center.
 4. DOWL Engineers will have welding & structural inspectors on site in July and concrete & masonry inspectors on site in August
- **Small Boat Harbor** – Floats are being installed the week of June 3-7, 2013.
- **Public Works Shop Floor** – Waiting on first barge for materials to continue project.

- **Fire Station Renovation** – All work has been completed for Phase II and contracts have been closed.
- **New Police Station** – Relocation to the new PD building commenced on Monday, June 3, 2013. The transfer of all police and emergency services should be completed within the next two (2) weeks.

Miscellaneous:

- **Department of Transportation** – In company with Mayor Klejka, met with Deputy Commissioner for Aviation Steven D. Hatter and his official party to discuss the Bethel Airport Master Plan and proposed expansion options. The Mayor made it abundantly clear that expansion to the west which would encompass the City's Sand Pit and Gun Range was totally unacceptable. Other DOT-related subjects that were discussed briefly were Tundra Ridge Road and Ridgecrest Drive. One other important issue that was discussed was the critical need for a traffic study with respect to the new Swanson's complex and the increased pedestrian and vehicular traffic that will evolve.
- **Trailer Court** – In company with the City Attorney, the Administration has been meeting with OMNI representatives to resolve the issue of water sales to non-trailer court housing and facilities.

The zoning request from the Charles family went forward to the City Council. The Planning Commission approved it on May 9th.

The Conditional Use Permit application for a 60-foot telecommunications tower was disapproved by the Planning Commission on May 23rd at a Special Meeting. United Utilities has inquired about possibly appealing the decision.

The Planning Department put forward a list of surveying needs to get a cost estimate. We are expecting a surveyor to survey several lots for the City during the month of June.

DOT will be coming out to Bethel to do test holes in Ridgecrest Drive as a preliminary to the widening of the road planned over the next couple of years.

Site Plan Permit Applications and Code Enforcement: We have issued fifteen Site Permits to date.

The Planner and City Attorney are focusing on nuisance properties. Processes to remedy this problem are being established that should help the Planning Department make some positive changes in the city. Ms. Burley's help is greatly appreciated.


Construction Projects:

Swimming Pool: Work will resume on the swimming pool when the barges come into the Port of Bethel. The community had a ground breaking ceremony to initiate the project on May 17th, with cake at the Log Cabin afterwards.

Prematernal Home and Long Term Care Facility: Siding and roofing are being constructed.

Dormitory: Yuut Elitnaurviat School has brought site plans to the Fire Department for review of the proposed dormitory. Their engineer has already had some conversations with Public Works and Planning about water and wastewater services.

Opportunities: There may be a grant available to move a family in a flood prone home to a new home. If anyone can identify an appropriate property, possibly by the Slough, let the Planner know.

Programs/Divisions

- All vehicles are up and running well with the exception of the 1972 Engine-2 which has serious problems with its Cummins Diesel engine.
- The new fire engine bids have been review and we are in the process of scoring and choosing the most responsive company that will meet our needs. That will be done this week and then we will start preparing the build package with the selected company.
- We are coordinating with the State Fire Marshal's office in Anchorage with regards to the large amount of commercial building going on in Bethel. An inspection visit for commercial structures is being planned for this summer.
- River breakup was uneventful in Bethel with no calls for assistance and no reports of flooded or damaged homes. We are always in touch with the National Guard, The Division of Homeland Security and the Red Cross for disaster assistance.

Staffing Issues/Concerns/Training

- We are fully staffed but keeping an open recruitment file active.
- An EMT meeting was held on May 21 in the evening at the Fire Station. A review of recent fire calls was conducted followed by training in the new State of Alaska Aurora emergency ambulance call reporting system. It is a computerized data entry system that allegedly will bring us into the 21st Century with regards to record keeping and retention.
- An EMT meeting was held on May 17th at the fire station. After run reviews EMS Instructor Fred Watson provided training on the Long Backboard and the immobilizing of patients.
- The next EMT meeting will be held on June 4th.

- A Fire meeting was held on May 23rd in the evening at the Fire Station. Training for the evening consisted of run reviews followed by training in water rescue conducted by Fire Instructor captain Howell. We trained using the floating Rescue Alive sled device, the inflatable Zodiac boat and the department's large aluminum boat. Watched the Rescue Alive video provided by the company for training purposes.
- A fire meeting was conducted on May 9th at the fire station. Fire Instructor Captain Howell conducted training in wildland fire operations. Safety and tactics refresher, went through our gear bags, practiced wildland hose deployments and the pump bags. Practiced with our ATV's which are loaded with firefighting gear. Practiced with the Floto-pumps.
- The next fire meeting will be held on June 13th.
- Captain Howell and staff continue to teach a State certified Firefighter I class to five students. Testing will be done on the week of the 23rd.

Budget/Financial

- The department is operating within its allocated budget.



Small Boat Harbor

- SBH Project

- Priorities set for remainder of the project with the COE.
- Finance Dept. working with DCCED to use the GO-BONDS. There will be a meeting June 13th with COE, Denali Commission, DCCED and the City's Finance & Port Departments.
- COE reports a hydrographic survey will be done this summer.
- Soil Sampling by the DEC still needs to be completed.

- Port of Bethel will sponsor the "Kids Don't Float." Program for the Bethel Small Boat Harbor. PFDs should arrive shortly.
- AMSEA has set up a safe boating program that the USCG felt might best serve the area needs for safe boating classes. The proposal will cost \$6,200 for an instructor and sixteen hours of instruction at the end of July, I'm hoping that enough adults will participate so that some of the cost can be recovered to allow the children's side of the program to go for free.
- Calista has not contacted me yet in regards to the sub-surface rights for the SBH
- The Port has made a pledge to be part of the Alaska Clean Harbors Program and to be certified as an environmentally responsible facility.

East Addition

- The TIGER Grant V was submitted 5/31/13. Opportunity Name: FY2013 National Infrastructure Investment. The application is for the Bethel Bank Stabilization Project.
- Strauss Property 208 East Avenue; AlaskaUSA was sent a registered letter on _____ and we are waiting for a response. This is for the removal of an abandon building.
- Bill Arnold looking at JB Crow's old well and is helping with advice on what steps to take to see if we can put it back into service.

Brown Slough

- All the barges will be removed this month. There is a chance if the owner of the Harvester wants to pay for the seasonal berth that this barge could remain. This doesn't look likely to happen.
- Soundings in the slough will be made sometime between 6/3/13 and 6/7/13.

City Dock

-General maintenance on the dock is progressing in expectation of USCG Facility Inspection.

- First barge is scheduled for 6/4/13 but ice still between the Johnson River & Eek Island poses a problem. The ship USCGC Hickory fell back from Buoy 12 to buoy 6 Sunday night due to ice. 

Programs/Divisions

Public Works Director:

CCI is out here this month to evaluate our Water Treatment Plants as most of the hardware in both Treatment Plants is becoming out dated and parts are becoming harder to get. The CCI guy will be here all week, 6-3-13 thru 6-7-13, and after he develops his assessment of both Plants and turns in his report of his findings we will then make determinations as to upgrading the Plants as needed.

We were lucky for the cold spring weather slowing up the river break-up process so there wasn't any critical flooding that took place in our Bethel area. We are grateful for the water levels not reaching critical stages and washing out several roads near the slough areas costing the City for rebuilding washed out roads.

Salzbrun Services and Drilling Inc. have the bad flooring areas removed and are waiting for the materials to be delivered by Barge which should be shortly after all the ice is out of the lower river and bay area.

83% of the year has elapsed with 87.3% expended

Utility Maintenance:

This month we responded to twelve after hour callouts. We also thawed a few frozen sewer lines in ASHA. We had also replaced the well at city sub water treatment plant. We also helped out with the floor drain at the City Shop. We also helped with the fire system at New Police Station. We continue to operate our water plants seven days a week. We also continue to monitor our liftstations seven days a week and rebuild sewer pumps when needed.

Piped Water: 83% of the year has elapsed with 80.4% expended
Piped Sewer: 83% of the year has elapsed with 82.9% expended
Sewer Lagoon: 83% of the year has elapsed with 78.7% expended
BHWTP: 83% of the year has elapsed with 95.1% expended
CSWTP: 83% of the year has elapsed with 74.7% expended

Hauled Utilities:

We've been getting a lot of stuff done. Attendance is a lot better. I have, Jonathan Phillip, in the office training. He will be my substitute when I am on time off. The guys have been busy changing tires on the trucks, taking studs off and putting on the unstudded. The end loader garbage truck is about ready for clean up/green up. Routes are getting done, all good.

Hauled Water: 83% of the year has elapsed with 81.5% expended
Hauled Sewer: 83% of the year has elapsed with 71% expended
Hauled Refuse: 83% of the year has elapsed with 74.5% expended
Landfill Operations: 83% of the year has elapsed with 103% expended

Property Maintenance:

We are keeping up with everyone's needs for repairs in most all the Departments. We have been doing repairs to the boardwalks as we get time also. There have been some issues with the heat and ventilation at the Court House, shorts in the electrical system that had affected thermostats, it's all taken care of now. We are going to have a contractor in here next month to look over the whole system. Nothing has really been done to bring all of this up to date.

All our boilers are being serviced to be ready for this winter. We are going to be busy all summer on projects and now is a good time to do a complete service. Frontier Fire Protection took care of our fire extinguishers, fire panels and sprinkler systems. We have some more work to do here at Public Works but they are pretty much done. Thank you.

83% of the year has elapsed with 79.1% expended

Road Maintenance:

Streets and Road is done with steaming culverts with acceptance of a few

culverts that show up later as being frozen and present a problem. In all we come out good this year with no major wash outs this year. Also during breakup this year we did have some sink holes that formed on some of the roads that got flooded. The sink holes that we filled in are at the boat harbor road and at the end of 4th Avenue.

Streets and Roads has moved the D8 Cat dozer out at the city sand pit by BIA road. We are now pushing up a pile of sand for spring emergencies, and for our use this summer. We will need this stockpile for road rebuilding this summer, for the Ports use, for road material and parking around the Pool project and also for the landfill use.

Streets and Roads have now started laying calcium chloride on the roads to help keep the dust down. As of now we have done Ridgecrest Dr., Akakeek St., BIA Road, and Ptarmigan St. As long as the roads are dusty and with the culvert steaming done we will work on putting calcium the remaining roads as needed. When we do we will use the road watering truck to water the roads, the sander truck to put a layer of calcium on the roads, and with the grader we will grade the layer of calcium into the roads. This will last longer and also the roads will set up and make it smoother for a longer period of time to drive on.

83% of the year has elapsed with 78.9% expended

Vehicles and Equipment:

We are still in a floor space transition period. More floor construction in the shop has made finding room to work a little more difficult, but we have been adapting very well. We have pretty much finished with the summer/winter tire swapping and have been able to get back to routine services and minor maintenance on vehicles again. Josh has received the new engine for transit bus 436 and has been working at getting that bus back in service soon.

83% of the year has elapsed with 74.3% expended

Transit System:

The first week of May (6-10) 2013 we had approximately 300 riders and a year ago, the same time period, we had over 500. I've compared the time of day the buses were running and we will be adjusting the current bus schedule to target last year's ridership. Starting the first of July the green

line will run from 6:30am to 10:00am and then from 11:30am to 6:00pm. The red line will start at 9:00am to 12:00n and then from 1:00 -3:00pm. There will be a bus serving the community from 6:30am to 6:00pm. With this change and the other incentives were offering hopefully we'll see an increase in the ridership.

On April 30 we handed out "free" passes. Each paid rider was given a free pass of equal value. The drivers handed out 78 free passes: 12 - \$1.00, 18-\$2.00 and 48 - \$3.00, so far the riders have only used 38. Some may have been lost and some may be saved for a rainy day. On Tuesday, May14, the drivers handed out 59 "free" Saturday passes. We don't normally operate on Saturday but May 18 was Saturday Market Day and several passengers suggested that the bus should run on those days. Bus #437 will run from 10:00am to 2:30pm and I'll be driving. I drove the bus on May 26 for the Vintage Airplane Show, 9:30-2:30, we had over 90 riders, coming and going. June 3 was our first day to use the "\$5 Day Pass" and I hope this will help increase the ridership.

The new motor for Bus #436 is being installed. It's no easy task! They have to remove the entire front of the bus to get at the motor. The maintenance staff is doing a great job. I'm not sure how they can keep on top of everything.

I will be taking leave from June 21 to July 12 and when I get back we'll be starting the airport route. The first week it operates I'd like to give each of the airlines, which serve the villages, 5 free passes /day to give to their incoming "village" passengers. It'd be an introduction to the Airport Route System. I have been in contact with YKHC, and AVCP and they are "thinking" about providing some support to the Airport Route. Basically the Airport Route will be serving mostly the incoming villagers, from the surrounding 45-55 villages, and YKHC and AVCP support those villages. Bobby Sutton, City Finance Director, is checking out whether or not we'd be able to use Medicaid Vouchers. Hopefully we'll be able to and that would make a big difference in over revenue for the system.

John Sargent, City Grant Manager, has done a great job and has submitted the grant for a new bus. Hopefully it'll be approved and make it on this summer's barge. We're requesting a 14 passenger bus, with a wheel chair lift, and gas operated. Gas is cheaper than diesel and they're easier to start in the winter. If we get the new bus, this year, it will take the place of Bus #436 which has in excess of 110,000 miles on it and we'll use it as back-up. Next year Bus #437 will have over 100,000 miles and we'll apply for another new one then. Good job John!

I'm very concerned about the Transit System budget, both this year (FY

2013) and next (FY2014). To make the Transit System more reliable and serve the people better we need to increase the number of trips per day, both routes, and may be run one bus part time on Saturday. All of this would cost additional money....which we don't have.

Bethel Transit System goal for the FY 2014 will be to show a 20-25 percent increase in ridership / revenue. I think we can do this by providing better serve for our passengers.

83% of the year has elapsed with 67% expended

OUT OF THE OFFICE

The City Clerk will be out of the office the week of June 10th on approved administrative leave. While out of the office, the City Clerk's Assistant will be available Monday through Friday from 1p-5p in the City Clerk's Office.

Records Retention

Modifications from the departments have been submitted. The City Clerk's Office is in the process of reviewing each document type which includes the suggested length of retention as well as the format of retention. Once completed with the final modification, the City Clerk will provide the document to the City Attorney for review before its submission to the City Council for approval.

The Office is also preparing for the next sendoff of ordinances for document preservation. The Council has provided funding for this project for three years now and with that funding we have been able to preserve and bind all ordinances from 1958 through 2001. Following the preservation of ordinances, the City Clerk's Office will start on the meeting minutes. Just a reminder, all meeting minutes, ordinances, resolutions and proclamations from the start of the City in 1958 are available on the City's website.

An introductory Laserphiche training was provided to the records managers of each department May 29th and another training is arranged for June 5th. Continuous training will be provided to each of the records managers throughout the year.

With the recent upgrade purchase to Laserphiche each department will have access to the software. The City will slowly migrate to long term and short term electronic records management.

Additionally, we will be going to each department to help organize the records files.

Election

Election Preparation is well underway.

On the 29th of July the City Clerk's Office will have available Declaration of Candidacy Packets available. The filing of the Candidacy packets will be between August 5th and August 20th. With the modifications to the Election Code approved by the department of justice, one significant change to note is that all write in candidates will still need to file a declaration of candidacy.

Notice of the election as well as voter registration requirements are ready for posting. Next step will be to update the City's website to include information on the 2013 election season.

Social Media

The City of Bethel is in the early, early stages of establishing a facebook page. The Social Media Policy is being reworked into an Ordinance for Council's consideration. This is not high on the priority list but is still on the to do list.

Passports

It is the passport season. The City Clerk's Office processes on average 10 passports a month but the next few months it could be as high as 10 a week. The new Assistant to the City Manager is in the process of getting trained and taking the Acceptance Agent test. Once she is approved by the Department of Justice the City will have two acceptance agents available to process passports.

Preclearance Request

The City Clerk's Office has submitted Ordinance 13-13 for Preclearance to the Department of Justice. The submission review will take approximately 60 days but will in no way interfere with the October 1, 2013 election requirements.

Board of Adjustment Hearing

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

The City of Bethel, which is located in the State of Alaska, in an unorganized borough, is requesting preclearance of the attached Elections Ordinance, 13-13, (Attachment A). Ordinance 13-13 amends the City of Bethel Municipal Code (BMC), by removing the financial disclosure submission requirements for individuals running for elective office as provided in Alaska Statutes Title 39.50.020 (Attachment B) and enacts the financial disclosure requirement outlined in Ordinance 13-04 amending BMC 2.05.080 (Attachment C) for individuals running for elective office.

The authority for this action is provided under AS 39.50.145 (Attachment B), which authorizes municipalities to exempt its municipal officers from the requirements if the question is passed by a majority of the voters voting at a regular or special election. The question of exemption was submitted to the voters by the Council under Ordinance 12-05 (Attachment D) and the election was certified under Resolution 12-21 (Attachment E).

The proposed changes will in no way deny or abridge any voter's right to vote on the basis of membership in a race or language minority. According to the 2010 US Census, the population of the City of Bethel was 7,632; with an approximate Alaska Native population of 71.3% (Attachment F). English is widely spoken. The

proposed change will not conflict with subsistence, fishing, or other activities nor interfere with any individual's right to vote.

There is not past or pending litigation concerning these changes. There was however litigation over translations at the Bethel polls. The plaintiffs and the City of Bethel have a consent decree (Attachment G) which explains the Department of Justice approved changes.
