CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Finance Committee was held on March 28, 2016 at 6:30 p.m. in City Council Chambers.

Meeting was called to order by Chair Carol Willard at 6:31 PM.

PEOPLE TO BE HEARD

Michelle DeWitt- At the prior meeting the attorney and finance director talked about sales tax only on 'ideal net,' which applies only to pull tabs. Worked up a scenario showing what BCSF would have paid in 2014 and 2015 if they had taxed at the ideal net structure at various percentages.

Tom Hawkins- (Board member with Bethel community services foundation) Wants to be taxed on gross receipts minus prizes rewarded. Ideal net idea is complicated and not what we wanted. The money goes back into the community by law. Some of the machines at the hospital, most of the dental training equipment come from gaming money.

Buck Bukowski- Today was the first day I've heard of ideal net. Seems like they pay more on taxes every month. The fence around the graveyard, mammography machine, those were bought with gaming money. Doesn't understand why they have to pay so much on sales taxes.

Member Shantz asked if we can defer approving the minutes from the last meeting until the next meeting. Once it’s been seconded it cannot be removed. There can be an amendment to the motion.

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OLD BUSINESS- Finance Director. The goal that we want to accomplish is to recognize that the non profits contribute to the city and also we need to find the right balance for both parties. We do not want any of the non profits to go under because of the sales tax and also we don’t want to establish a rate that is so low that the city would also be in jeopardy of losing revenue for the general fund. All the gaming sales tax goes into the general fund. On an annual basis we receive 450,000 to 500,000 a year. The goal is to make a recommendation to city council.

At this time Chair Willard has a conflict of interest because she works for BSCF Bingo and passed the meeting over to the co-chair Jon Cochrane.

VOTE ON MOTION	1 person voted against the recommendation, the motion carried by vote.
