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Ordinance #5, the garbage ordinance was read. Miller gave the following garbage disposal requisites for the City:

- 1-The city will maintain the dump.
- 2-Burning at the dump will be done by the garbage collector.
- 3-Garbage disposal containers may be the size of 50 gallon drums but may not be filled more than 2/3 of capacity.
- 4-Garbage disposal containers are to be kept covered.
- 5-No human wastes are to be placed in garbage containers.
- 6-Service is to be weekly to begin with, to be increased as necessary.
- 7-Individuals are to furnish their own containers.
- 8-Garbage will be dumped at the present city dump.
- 9-Garbage containers for pick-up should be placed no further from the road than 20 feet.
- 10-Payment for removal of the garbage is to be made by the individual to the garbage collector.

The Mayor stated that she did not believe that the city could take payment for garbage.

A petition for garbage pickup at the city's expense was presented and read.

Mr. Nicholson said that the City can collect for garbage service. Much discussion was held with the floor. Nicholson suggested that the City obtain an REA loan to establish a City PUD.

The clerk is to write the City Attorney re collection for garbage.

The City will contract to have the city dump kept level.

A motion was made by Miller to put out bids for monthly maintenance of the dump. Persons seconded. Elliott volunteered to be chairman of a committee to see if this could be done free. The motion was tabled.

The garbage ordinance was read for the second time. A vote was called for its passage. 6 ayes. Onays.

The Mayor asked if anyone objected to having the third reading of the garbage ordinance at this time. Mr. Nicholson objected. Reading of the garbage ordinance for the third time was not done.

Much discussion with the floor was held.

Guinn suggested that the petition be forwarded to the City Attorney for his information and aid.

Under new business a liquor petition was presented by Ray Miller and Howard Elliot. The petition requested that vote for or against liquor be placed off the ballot at the next general election. Ray Miller said that they would like this changed to a special election. Howard Elliot requested that the petition read "for the sale of intoxicating liquors, yes or no" rather than for the sale of intoxicating liquors by Howard Elliot and Ray Miller. yes or no."

The petition was accepted by the council for clarification for the next meeting.

Dr. Jackson thanked everyone for his help in her absence from the city. She invited public participation in community affairs. She appointed ~~Ray Miller~~ ^{Ray Miller} Chairman of a water committee. Donald Schantz and Ben Smit volunteered to assist.

Guinn moved that the meeting be adjourned. Miller seconded.
