

Special Meeting of the City Council Dec, ~~22~~ 28th, 1959

The question of the city and the jail was brought up by the Mayor. A letter from Mr. Winsor on this topic was read. A Resolution concerning the jail was read by Persons. Maggie Lind maintained that she had not understood the petition.

Charles Guinn Jr. discussed the curfew question. He said that the present 16 year age limit was ok with the kids but they objected to raising it to 17 or 18 years.

Mr. Nicholson presented a very thorough paper on the garbage and sewage. Much discussion followed. Mr. Nicholson estimated that Approximately 25 families could not be reached for service.
