ORDINANCE #01-10

AN ORDINANCE EXEMPTING THE CITY'S ACQUISITION OF A TRUCK FROM THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 4.20 OF THE BETHEL MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS the City needs to replace two old water trucks that are leaking water; and

WHEREAS the City currently spends approximately \$250,000 per year maintaining these trucks; and

WHEREAS these units should have been replaced in 1998; and

WHEREAS the City located a 1997 used Ford truck with low hours and low mileage that can be purchased for \$44,925; and

WHEREAS purchasing the used truck would save the City approximately \$50,000; and

WHEREAS the truck can be used by the City for more than just hauling water; and

WHEREAS the City Council has determined that purchasing the truck is in the public interest because it fulfills a public need for water service and saves the public money over time;

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Bethel, Alaska, that:

SECTION 1. Classification. This ordinance is not permanent or general in nature and shall not be placed in the Bethel Municipal Code.

SECTION 2. Chapter 4.20 of the Bethel Municipal Code shall not apply to the purchase of the truck described in the attached Vehicle Sales Order.

SECTION 3. The City Council hereby approves the acquisition of the truck, such approval to be effective for all actions of the City administration taken to negotiate the settlement agreement.


SECTION 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption and shall have retroactive effect back to the first date that the City administration began to negotiate for acquisition of the truck.
