INTEROPERABLE EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS GRANT APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the City of Bethel is one of 31 communities in Alaska eligible to participate in the Interoperable Emergency Communications Grant Program administered by the State of Alaska, Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management;

WHEREAS, the Alaska Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management offers the interoperable emergency communications grant opportunity to eligible communities to promote the purchase of interoperable communications equipment;

WHEREAS, although the annual grant deadline was in May, the grant program director informed the City of Bethel that reallocated funds are available and encouraged the City of Bethel to submit an application for funding;


WHEREAS, the Bethel Police Department, Fire Department, and Port of Bethel have a need for portable and mobile radios to foster interoperable communication among first responders and Port security personnel;

WHEREAS, no cash match is required from the City of Bethel;
