PRESENT: Cooke, Crow, Hoffman and Murphy. ABSENT: Romer, Connick and Gregory.


Public Hearing on Ordinance 54 - mooring of barges for the loading and unloading of cargo along the waterfront. 3 of 5 persons were present for the Public Hearing. Discussion followed. The City Attorney in a message through Shuler recommends that it not be passed as it will be extremely difficult to deny a person using private property the right to moore barges and prove it to be a hazard to the safety, well-being and welfare of the community. We could be sued and it could beccostly.

Discussion followed about how this Ordinance would allow the City to control use along the waterfront and sea wall and if barges docked along the sea wall and it appeared they would do damage, this Ordinance would control their use.


