

Regular Council Meeting  
April 10, 1972

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 8:15 P.M., by Mayor Guinn, KVNA Building, Bethel.

ROLL CALL

PRESENT: Cooke, Guinn, Hoffman, Murphy, Romer  
ABSENT: Dale, Zahradnicek (late)

READING OF MINUTES

The Clerk read the minutes of 3-27-72. Councilman Zahradnicek walked in. There were no additions or corrections, so the Chair approved them as read. The Clerk then read the minutes of 3-29-72. Councilwoman Cooke said the Amendment was made by Zahradnicek and seconded by Cooke, not the other way around. The Chair then approved the minutes as corrected. She then read the minutes of 4-5-72. Councilwoman Cooke said it was not the question whether the Yut Group had taken 2 and 4, and she wanted to delete "will the City of Bethel still have the right to the use of the old airport across the river?" John Guinn wanted the minutes to read "whatever would make-up 2 1/2 acres in lot 4 instead of "which is lot 4."

Mayor Guinn explained to Paul Gregory, the map of the 5 1/2 acre lot at Bethel Heights. Mr. Gregory said it was unfair to him since he was the Chairman of the Native Village Corp. Mr. Guinn said, that is what Mary Hartzell and Issac Mute agreed upon besides they had first choice on what property.

Mr. Guinn then corrected the minutes to read, "the appraisal of the 5 1/2 acres was not to exceed 16 thousand dollars." He then approved the minutes as corrected.

He also said he had negotiated a contract with ASHA, Bobby Capps, for snow removal from the Bethel Heights raods and Courts.

A letter was read from Jack Baxter in which he was resigning from the position of accountant for the City of Bethel.


