#### **A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE CAMAI DANCE FESTIVAL 2001 AND PROVIDING A DONATION IN THE AMOUNT OF TAXES COLLECTED ON ADMISSIONS AND CONCESSIONS SOLD DURING THE FESTIVAL**

**WHEREAS,** The Camai Dance Festival is a celebration of culture and dance, and;

**WHEREAS,** Twenty-three dance groups and more than 400 dancers, drummers and singers between the ages of 2 and 92 will celebrate the Yup'ik Eskimo tradition of dance, and;

**WHEREAS,** Camai promotes cultural diversity as Native Alaskan, Native American and international groups share in the common language of dance, and;

**WHEREAS,** Camai also provides for additional activities during the festival such as a Miss and Mr. Camai contest, native foods dinner for everyone, a quilt show and arts and crafts sales, and;

**WHEREAS,** Through dance, song and crafts, the traditions of Alaskan Native tribes are communicated to hundreds of people during the three-day festival, and;

**WHEREAS,** The Camai Dance Festival promotes positive activities in the Bethel community and generates positive statewide publicity for the City of Bethel while bringing many visitors to the Bethel community, and;

**WHEREAS,** The City of Bethel recognizes the significance of the Camai Dance Festival and supports the dancers.


