RESOLUTION # 328

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BETHEL, ALASKA SUPPORTING FOR THE CONTINUATION OF THE PHILLIPS ALCOHOLISM TREATMENT CENTER.

WHEREAS, the Phillips Alcoholism Treatment Center is the primary information and treatment resource which deals with alcohol problems in our community; and,

WHEREAS, the "Statement of Community Attitude: Analysis of Bethel Community Survey, Bethel Comprehensive Development Plan", October, 1979, found that the use of alcohol and drugs was the single major social concern of the people of our community; and,

WHEREAS, according to the Comprehensive Development Survey, 61% of those surveyed felt that alcohol and drug related crime was the most significant public safety factor identified in Bethel; and,

WHEREAS, the Phillips Alcoholism Treatment Center has treated 2,800 clients through its Emergency Detox Center, 96 clients through its Intermediate Care Program, and 500 outpatient clients; and,


WHEREAS, there is a present and continuing need for the continuation of funding from the State of Alaska SOADA, at the stated level of 10% over present year allocated amounts; and,

WHEREAS, if there is a reduction in State Alcohol Funds to our region, significant setbacks in alleviating a major disease will occur.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of Bethel, Alaska, request continued support of SOADA by the House Finance Committee.
