

SPECIAL MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL

The meeting was called to order at 8:15 PM.

The minutes of the previous meeting to be read at the next regular council meeting.

There were no communications, reports from council members, committee reports, or mayor's comments.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. City Administrator position.

A discussion was held on the City Administrator position. Mr. Nicholson stated that there should not be a contract for the position. He also mentioned the duties of the administrator would be to take over the the duties of the mayor's office. This individual would handle the daily city business, supervise city employees, look into long-term projects that would benefit the welfare and economy of the city, apply to Federal and State Agencies for all different grants made available and whatever may deem necessary to aid the city.

M/M H. Elliott M/S T. Christiansen that the City hire Mike Rowan with a year's contract. The motion was withdrawn.

M/M H. Elliott M/S T. Christiansen that the Council accept Mike Rowan's application and that if he will be available and faithfully perform his duties, the City will guarantee him \$9,000 at a salary of \$900 per month. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Rowan's contract to become effective Saturday, May 21, with a guarantee until March 21 and the contract terminating May 21, 1967.

2.2.0 Resolution for proposed museum.

M/M T. Christiansen M/S H. Elliott that Resolution 26 be accepted in its first reading. Passed unanimously.

Since an application for Centennial funds must be submitted shortly, Resolution 26 was offered in its second and final reading.
