

RESOLUTION 445

CITY of BETHEL

A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Bethel requesting that the Alaska Board of Parole give favorable consideration to George H. Hohman's Parole application.

WHEREAS: George H. Hohman has served our area of Alaska and the City of Bethel for more than 20 years, and

WHEREAS: George H. Hohman was convicted of bribery, a class 'B' felony and sentenced to serve a three year sentence, and

WHEREAS: George H. Hohman began to serve that three year sentence on February 17, 1984, and

WHEREAS: A person incarcerated under a sentence such as received by George H. Hohman is eligible for parole after serving one third of the sentence and

WHEREAS: George H. Hohman will present himself to the Alaska State Board of Parole when it meets in Palmer in the first part of January, and

WHEREAS: George H. Hohman has compiled an excellent record during his stay at Palmer Correctional Center with regard to work assignment, room inspections, and relationships to fellow inmates and staff alike, and

WHEREAS: George H. Hohman's return to Bethel would be well received by the majority of the population in Bethel, and

WHEREAS: Continued incarceration of George H. Hohman, would serve no understandable societal need, and

WHEREAS: George H. Hohman's return to our community would in all probability, see a continuation of his record of Public and Community Service which has stretched over 20 years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Bethel City Council respectfully requests that the Alaska Board of Parole favorably consider George H. Hohman's parole application.
