

## REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING - AUGUST 26, 1968

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Arthur Nicholson. Roll was called.

REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

M/M Swanson, Laroux that the liquor store closing time be placed on the agenda.

M/M Hoffman, Swanson that the upper-end Sea Wall be placed on the agenda. Passed 5-1

PRISONER FEEDING- M/M Swanson, Crow that letter be written to Tony Lewis stating that Meals are inadequate and must be improved. Passed

COMPENSATION FOR TEMPORARY POLICE HELP:

M/M Swanson, Hoffman that police help be paid \$3.00 per hour.

M/M Crow, Hoffman that motion be tabled. Passed 5-1

MATERIALS AND SUPPLIES FOR CITY POLICEMAN:

M/M Nicholson, Swanson that equipment be considered at this time. Passed

M/M Nicholson, Laroux that items requested by the City Policeman be purchased except the fingerprint kit, liquid mace and 38 military special. Amendment was offered that the Police Committee check into excepted items. Motion passed as amended.

M/M Crow, Hoffman that the Police Compensation be placed back on the agenda. Passed

M/M Nicholson, Crow that the City Administrator contact Alexie Brink and ask him what would be fair compensation and investigate if Brink would be available if he were called upon at later dates. Passed unanimously.

POLICE TRAINEE:

M/M Nicholson, Swanson that the City accept a Police trainee for 14 weeks. Passed Unanimously

FILL ON SEA WALL:

M/M Crow, Hoffman that this agenda item be tabled until the next meeting. Passed 5-1 in favor

SURVEY OF CITY SAND PIT:

M/M Nicholson, J.B. Haroldsen that the City Administrator ask Dick Breenen to establish the corners of Pit Lake and to use metal stakes that stick up 2 feet above the ground.

Passed Unanimously



CITY VEHICLE:

M/M Nicholson, Haroldsen that the city purchase a station wagon of the Chevrolet Biscayne class or equal for the City Administrator. Motion of amendment to add a large heater, undercoating, standard transmission mud and snow tires.

ENCROACHMENT OF ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY

Mr. Schmit entered a protest that the ~~5th~~ road at 6th and Main was ~~100~~ on private property.

M/M Nicholson, Haroldsen that Harry Faulkner be informed that his house is on the right - of - way, andthat he be asked to remove it within 30 days. Passed ~~xxx~~ unanimously.

HOFFMAN TRUCK RENTAL

M/M Haroldsen, Crow that Hoffman receive \$5.00 per day for 30 days. Amendment by Nicholson  
Haroldsen that the rental cost be charged against the slough contract. Passed Unanimously

JAIL GUARD OVERTIME

It was decided to ask the Police Committee to check on over-time and time off.

M/M Crow, Haroldsen that this item be tabled until a report from the Police Committee.  
Passed Unanimously

OLD HOUSE AND CARS ON AIR STRIP: M/M Crow, Swanson that *Carl Ewon* be allowed to move house on to land controlled by City without title to the land. Passed 5-1

M/M Swanson, Crow that cars be removed by August 29th, and that the City Administrator be authorized to remove them at the owners expense. Passed unanimously.

Sea Wall to Upper end of Town- Tabled

LIQUOR STORE CLOSING:

M/M Swanson, Crow that effective September 1, the liquor store be closed at 6 pm.

Motion of recommendation to Liquor Board. Passed Unanimously

M/M Crow, Haroldsen that the meeting be adjourned. Passed.
