National Telecommunicators Week April 9-15, 1995

Whereas, thousands of dedicated telecommunicators daily serve the citizens of the United States and Canada by answering their telephone calls for police, fire and emergency medical services and by dispatching the appropriate assistance as quickly as possible; and

Whereas, the critical functions performed by professional telecommunicators also include those related to forestry and conservation operations, highway safety and maintenance activities, and many other operations performed by federal, state and local government agencies; and

Whereas, professional telecommunicators work to improve the emergency response of these communications systems through their leadership and participation in training programs and other activities provided by the Associated Public-Safety Communications Officers, Inc.; and

Whereas, the Associated Public-Safety Communication Officers, Inc., an organization of more than 10,000 people engaged in the design, installation and operation of emergency response communications systems, has set aside the second week of April to recognize telecommunicators and their crucial role in the protection of life and property.
