SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING

5 November 1970

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Bill Zahradnicek. Roll was called:
PRESENT: Baxter, Bruce Crow, Eddie Hoffman, John Guinn, Kevin Murphy, Ben Dale,
Bill Zahradnicek.
ABSENT: None.

Invitation for Bids on Maintenance of City Dump: Mr. Webb explained that the contractor must carry liability insurance and have a business license. Jack Baxter suggested that future contracts be released for bid prior to end of fiscal year, so the money can be budgeted for the new year. Baxter asked that the date of termination, 30 June 1971, be filled in. M/M Baxter, Hoffman that the contract be accepted as written and the bids be let for a period of 30 days. The termination date of contract to be 30 June, 1971. Motion passed unanimously.

Invitation for Bids on Maintenance of City Streets: M/M Baxter, Hoffman that the contract be accepted in its writing and be let for bids for a period of 30 days, with a termination date of 30 June 1971. Motion carried unanimously.

Bethel Social Services, Inc.: Crow raised the question of who would control the rents on the Cowan Hut, and asked for clarification of who would receive said rents. Mr. Webb stated the City would control the rate of rentals and also receive any monies accrued from this source.

Dick Schneider stated that the present practice of allowing private individuals to rent the Cowan Hut for a dance, will be discontinued. Bethel Social Services will sponsor any future dances, which will be chaperoned accordingly. The profits from the dances will accrue to the account of the Youth Club, itself. Whatever musical group is performing, will be hired at a set figure.

Mr. Webb questioned the operating budget of the Youth Club. He felt that with a City budget of \$20,000., plus all the monies from the dances, that the City would have to bear the complete maintenance of all the buildings in addition to the \$20,000.

Disc Schneider said the Teens had approved their own budget of \$4,400., which is to be used in equipping the new building. The amount of supplies and furnishings yet to be purchased, will deplete this amount about half. The remainder to be used for their programming. Each of the severidstanding committees will have a budget of \$100., with which to work.

Mr. Webb then asked who would be responsible for janitorial services, and Mr. Schneider said that would depend on the final contract.



Baxter questioned the Administrator on the figure of \$2,500. to be paid to BSS, Inc. each month. Mr. Webb replied this was for personnel and programming. M/M Crow, Dale that the City Administrator be authorized to negotiate with Bethel Social Services, Inc. to contract for a total recreation program for the City within the range of \$30,000. per year. Motion carried unanimously.

Bethel Broadcasters, Inc. & State Dept. of Education: M/M Hoffman, Guinn that both of these contracts for professional services to be furnished by the City of Bethel, be approved. Motion passed. Baxter dissented.

The City Administrator read a proposal for a Neighborhood Facility Building.

M/M Crow, Dale that Council approve the alternate plan 3 to secure commitments from the State and Hud for a complete Neighborhood Facility building. Motion passed unanimously.

M/M Crow, Baxter that Council express its gratitude for use of the cafeteria for tonight's meeting. Motion passed unanimously for adjournment.
