

ORDINANCE #121

AN ORDINANCE WHEREBY THE CITY OF BETHEL ESTABLISHES REFLECTING DEVICES REGULATIONS TO PREVENT INJURY TO PERSONS, ANIMALS OR VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BETHEL THAT:

Reflective Devices Ordinance shall have the following Sections:
9.18.010 Purpose; 9.18.020 Obstructions; 9.18.030 Vehicles; and
9.18.040 Penalty read as follows:

9.18.010 Purpose

The purpose of this Chapter is to prevent injury to persons, animals, or vehicles.

9.18.020 Obstructions

Any person or persons who own or possess property shall post reflective devices on poles, fences, guy wires, tree supports, chains, or other possible obstructions. These obstructions must be marked in a manner that is visible during inclement weather and darkness. Each obstruction must have a sufficient number of reflective devices to assure visibility from at least twenty-five (25) feet.

9.18.030 Vehicles


No person shall operate any snowmobile, bicycle, scooter, or any other vehicle unless it is marked with a reflective device on the front and rear of the vehicle. The vehicle must be marked with a reflective device that is visible during inclement weather and darkness.

9.18.040 Penalty


Any person or persons violating the provisions of this Chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not to exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or be sentenced to serve a term to to exceed five (5) days in the City Jail, or both such fine and imprisonment.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BETHEL:


That Section 9.18.020 obstruction of the reflecting devices
ordinance is amended to read as follows;

9.18.020 OBSTRUCTION:

Any person or persons who own or possess property shall
post reflective devices on fences, guy wires, tree supports,
chain, or other possible obstructions. These obstructions
must be marked in a manner that is visible during inclement
weather and darkness. Each obstruction must have a sufficient
number of reflective devices to assure visibility from at
least twenty-five (25) feet.


