ORDINANCE #94-19

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 14, HARBORS AND PORTS, BY ADDING CHAPTERS 14.04.060-.070, FISHING FROM CARGO DOCK AND PETROLEUM DOCK PROHIBITED

WHEREAS, fishing from the City cargo dock and petroleum dock is potentially dangerous to life and limb, a potential hazard to navigation, and has the potential to interfere with the orderly flow of traffic at and across the cargo dock and petroleum dock; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bethel has the power under Title 29 of the Alaska Statutes to regulate in the interests of health and safety, and to regulate the operation and use of municipal facilities and services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Bethel, Alaska, as follows:

Section 1. Title 14 of the Bethel Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding Sections 14.04.060-.070, Fishing from City Cargo Dock and Petroleum Dock Prohibited.

Section 2. Sections 14.04.060-.070 of the Bethel Municipal Code are hereby adopted as follows:

14.04.060 Fishing from City Cargo Dock and Petroleum Dock Prohibited. Fishing from the petroleum dock and the City cargo dock is prohibited during the months of June, July and August.

14.04.070 Fine. For each violation of Section 14.04.060, the City may assess a penalty in the amount of \$25. The City may assess and collect this penalty without a court appearance.

Section 3. If any part or provision of this ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstance is adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgement shall be confined in its operation to the part, provision or application directly involved in any controversy in which this judgement shall have been rendered, and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this title or application thereof to other persons or circumstances. The City Council hereby declares that it would have enacted the remainder of this ordinance even without such part, provision or application.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be effective upon adoption.
