

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BETHEL CITY COUNCIL

October 19, 1964

Bethel Library

8:00 P.M.

Present: Schirmer, Eddie Hoffman, Jimmy Hoffman, Elliott, Sallison, Mendola and Nicholson.

The purpose of the meeting was to hear a proposed ordinance on Sanitation and a proposed resolution on River bank erosion.

Mayor Nicholson opened the meeting by explaining that there are many people who are not subscribing to the sanitation service and, as such, are creating a greater health hazard. The proposed ordinance is an amendment to ordinance no. 15, repealing and re-enacting sections 1, 2 and 3.

There was an open discussion on the sanitation problem. Mayor Nicholson proposed that in cases where a person is financially unable to subscribe to the service, the Magistrate can appoint a committee to study the person's finances. If the claim is well founded, the city could then pick up the waste and the cost to the City would be \$1.00 per month for billing.

The Mayor also pointed out that there are several people who live alone and do not have a need for the three times per week service. These people could have service once per week at a cost of 55¢ per bucket, plus \$1.00 per month billing charge.

The proposed ordinance (ordinance 24) was put into its first reading. MElliott/E. Hoffman that the ordinance be adopted as amended. 6 Ayes and no nays.
Second reading by title: 6 ayes and no nays.
Third reading by title: 6 ayes and no nays.
Ordinance 24 passed and approved, effective date October 19, 1964.

Resolution 16, on river bank erosion, was put into its first reading.

Eddie Hoffman brought contracts and a notice of Deposit of \$3,000.00 with the First National Bank from the Alaska Rural Development agency. This money and the previous \$5,000.00 to be used for labor. The \$3,000.00 fund is labeled "Bethel Work Project No 3"

There was a discussion on how to get Northern Commercial Company to participate in the project. It was decided that a letter would be written to the N.C. officials, enclosing a copy of the resolution (if passed) and request their participation.

MElliott/E. Hoffman that the resolution be adopted as amended. Sallison, Elliott, E. Hoffman, J. Hoffman, J. Mendola, Schirmer in favor. MC

Mr Mather talked to the Council on the need of funds for the High school athletic fund. The state does not furnish uniforms nor transportation to other areas for competitive games.

ME Schirmer/E. Hoffman that \$500.00 from the Youth Activity fund be turned over to the High School Athletic fund as working capital. Schirmer, E. Hoffman, J. Hoffman, Mendola, Elliott, Sallison in Favor. MC

ME Mendola/Schirmer that the athletic equipemnt belonging to the City be given to the Bethel School. 6 ayes and 0 nays.

ME Schirmer/E. Hoffman that the meeting be adjourned. MC
