Resolution #03-18

A RESOLUTION OF THE BETHEL CITY COUNCIL COMMITTING TO APPROPRIATE THE REQUIRED CASH MATCH FUNDS TO THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Bethel adopted resolution #02-32 authorizing the City of Bethel's participation in the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG), and;

WHEREAS, The intention of the City of Bethel's participation in the CDBG Program is to upgrade/renovate the Chief Eddie Hoffman Senior Center, and;

WHEREAS, The City of Bethel has subsequently been awarded the CDGB grant, and;

WHEREAS, As stated in resolution #02-32, the CDBG Program requires a 100% match, in which 25% is required to be a cash match, and;

WHEREAS, Resolution #02-32 quoted an estimation of the required cash match dollar amount, resolution #03-18 provides for the exact amount, and;


WHEREAS, The following organizations have contributed to the efforts of securing the cash match and to the intentions of the City of Bethel to provide community elders with the best possible service:



AVCP Housing Authority	\$10,000.00
Calista Elders Council	\$ 1,000.00
Yukon-Kuskokwim Health Corporation	\$ 2,500.00

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City Council of Bethel hereby authorizes the required remaining cash match of \$63,000.00 be appropriated out of the General Fund to the CDBG Program and authorizes the City Manager to negotiate and execute any and all documents required for granting and managing funds on behalf of the City of Bethel.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the City Manager is also authorized to execute subsequent amendments to said grant agreement and to provide for adjustments to the project within the scope of services or tasks, based upon the needs of the Senior Center project.
