A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BETHEL AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO DISCUSSIONS WITH DONLIN CREEK MANAGEMENT PERSONNEL AND ITS ASSOCIATED CORPORATIONS REGARDING THE PORT OF BETHEL'S ENVISIONED PLANS FOR POSSIBLE FUTURE EXPANSION

WHEREAS, the City of Bethel is currently evaluating plans to expand its port with a new facility; corrected

WHEREAS, the City of Bethel and the State of Alaska have not yet effected a satisfactory plan to transfer the City Dock ownership from the State to the City, due to its estimated cost of repairs;


WHEREAS, at times, the Port of Bethel is unable to service in a timely fashion the barges that come to Bethel due to limited mooring space;


WHEREAS, the management of Donlin Creek has indicated sustained interest in basing logistical operation on the Lower Kuskokwim;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Bethel City Council authorizes the City Manager to enter into informal discussion with Donlin Creek representatives for the purpose of determining if there might be an opportunity for the City and Donlin Creek to work jointly in partnership in solidifying the plans for Port expansion in the City of Bethel.
