A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING EFFORTS TO SECURE A BROWNFIELDS CLEAN-UP GRANT FROM THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA)

Whereas, The City of Bethel is an eligible entity to apply for EPA Brownfields environmental clean-up funding, which was discussed at the November 26, 2002 City Council meeting, and;

Whereas, The City of Bethel may apply for up to \$200,000 for up to five sites, and;

Whereas, The City of Bethel has the public's best interest in mind and desires to clean-up two pieces of property that would be used for a public purpose, and;


Whereas, A Brownfield site is "real property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant," and;


Whereas, The two sites the City will apply for funding for are: Lot 3, Block 2 of the City Center Subdivision—also know as the "Omni property"; and Lots 4 & 5, Block 8, US Survey 3790, East Addition of the Bethel Townsite—also known as the "Crow property," and;

Whereas, There is a 20% cost share that may be in the form of in-kind or cash, and;

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that the City of Bethel, City Council, authorizes and supports City Administration's efforts to secure funding for an EPA Brownfields Clean-up grant for the benefit of the community and agrees to provide for the required cost share, if awarded the grant.
