OLD BUSINESS:

Motion was made by B. Crow that 3 city lots, 9,10,11, be designated as location of the community center at a value of \$4,500 for three city lots. The motion was seconded by Ed Hoffman and passed unanimously.

J.B. Haroldson was appointed to the Recreation Committee.

Motion was made by B. Crow and seconded by J. Pike that the council go back to two meetings a month on the second and fourth Mondays. Passed unanimously.

STREET LIGHTS:

Motion was made by Bruce Crow and seconded by Ed Hoffman to place this on the agenda for the next regular meeting. Passed

VEHICLE BIDS:

Motion was made by Ed Hoffman and seconded by Bruce Crow to accept J. Miller bid. Passed.

Motion was made to put resolution 43 on agenda by Pike, seconded by Haroldson. Unanimous Motion was made by Pike that Resolution 43 be accepted in the 1st reading. Motion seconded by Hoffman. Passed unanimously.

Motion was made by Pike, seconded by Haroldson that Resolution 43 be accepted in 2nd and final reading. Passed unanimously.

ORDINANCE 41:

Motion was made by Pike, seconded by Crow that Ordinance 41 be accepted in 1st reading. Advanced to second reading. Discussion - Amendment was made by Ed Hoffman and seconded by Bruce Crow to change the age to 14 years of age (section 5-A) Amendment was voted down by a vote of 3 - 2

NEW BUSINESS:

SEA WALL:

Motion was made by Bruce Crow, seconded by Hoffman that the council favorably consider the sea wall expansion and request State and Federal funding that might be available. Passed unanimously.

Motion made and seconded that the council continue beyond 10:00 pm

CAMP FIRE GIRLS:

Bruce Crow made a motion that we contribute the same amount as last year (\$1,800) seconded by J.B. Haroldson. Passed unanimously.

POLICE CONTRACT: Referred to Police Committee

FUEL OIL BID:

Bruce Crow made a motion that the bid be accepted, seconded by Haroldson. Unanimous

DINNER FOR COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION:

Motion was made by Bruce Crow "that the city host a dinner for the commissioner and request a definite statement from the Commissioner of Education of the State of Alaska and the Commissioner of the Bureau of Indian Affairs as to their determinatrous relation to an early construction date for our regional high school. Further, that their reply be requested prior to the anticipated April 9, visit of Commissioner Hartman.

Nicholson asked for council approval to pay his expenses. Motion was made by Hoffman, seconded by Crow. Passed unanimous.

Motion was made by Bruce Crow that the city send a letter to the ADFG Board expressing its approval of proposals for sale of subsistence roe and permitting five year residents the right to fish commercially on the Kuskokwim River in 1968 Motion was seconded by Hoffman and passed unanimously. Meeting was adjourned.
