RESOLUTION #360

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BETHEL, ALASKA, REQUESTING FURTHER COOPERATION FROM THE ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS, ALASKA DISTRICT, CONCERNING THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE BETHEL SMALL BOAT HARBOR.

WHEREAS, the Army Corps of Engineers, Alaska District, has completed the Final Detailed Project Report and Final Environmental Impact Statement for the Bethel Small Boat Harbor; and

WHEREAS, the Bethel City Council has previously chosen the Lousetown Slough area as the best site for the proposed Small Boat Harbor; and

WHEREAS, the budget as drawn by the Army Corps of Engineers requires a non-federal share of \$2,777,400.00; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bethel has received the full non-federal share of \$2,777,400.00; and

WHEREAS, the non-federal share constitutes 66% of the total project cost; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bethel desires to begin work on the project as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bethel has received no firm assurances that the Corps of Engineers will receive funding for their share of the project in a timely manner,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Bethel, Alaska, hereby requests that the Army Corps of Engineers allow the City of Bethel to begin work as soon as possible with the City's share of the project cost and that the Corps of Engineers continue to pursue funding for their share of the project and apply that to the total project cost when received.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Army Corps of Engineers allow for an exchange of work outlined in the final report in order to allow for timely construction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Administration be directed to begin negotiations with the Army Corps of Engineers to meet the desired end of the establishment of a Bethel Small Boat Harbor by splitting project responsibilities in a different manner to allow construction to begin as soon as possible.
