

REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
14 December 1970

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Bill Zahradnicek. Roll was called.

Present: Bill Zahradnicek, Kevin Murphy, Eddie Hoffman, Bruce Crow and Jack Baxter.

Absent: John Guinn and Ben Dale

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved with correction to the motion by Dale/Crow regarding \$2,000.00 for Bethel Council on Alcoholism. Mayor Zahradnicek stated the motion should include that the funds come from the 1970-1971 budget.

Communications: (A) 1) The City Administrator read the following communication:  
1) telegram from Senator Ted Stevens re: mandatory transfer policy for BIA personnel, i.e. Dic Birchell.

Mayor Zahradnicek inquired about Wien's Bethel service. Mr. Webb said he talked with Wien officials today and that service should be somewhat improved as the jet coming to Bethel previously was serving Barrow on the same day. Now Bethel will be serviced by another jet. Also, scheduling will be changed in April to a 6:00 A.M. or 7:00 A.M. DST departure from Anchorage. Wien suggest the City canvass an opinion and return suggestions on the spring scedule if an early morning departure is not satisfactory.

Administrator's Report

Braund Factory Building - Mr. Webb said the acceptance of the building is still pending sprinkler system approval by Paul Cruz. Modification has been made to the system and approval should be coming forthwith. Once approved, the temporary classrooms may be put to use.

Mr. Webb also elaborated on the BIA mandatory transfer policy. Senator Stevens recommended resolutions from the villages regarding Dic Birchell's proposed transfer. The original directive issued by Commissioner Ruess, (BIA) has been revised somewhat.

OLD BUSINESS

YKHC Resolution - Mr. Webb reported representatives of YKHC (Dr. De'ak), KVNA (Robert Nick), BSS (Jorene Hout), City (David Webb), PHS (Dr. Nakamura) and Dr. Carpenter met December 8th to come up with some recommendations regarding State Comprehensive Health Plan. Phillip Gye who was to represent AVCP was not present. A four point compromise conditional to YKHC being awarded the franchise agency for State Comprehensive Health Planning in this area was read. Councilman Crow established the objectivity of the compromise proposal was possibly a concensus of the majority of that group meeting. Discussion resulted in a pre-motion statement, then motion by Crow/Hoffman "since comprehensive health planning is obviously serving the area and since AVCP was not represented apparently at this six or seven man meeting, I would move the City Council table the YKHC resolution until such time as AVCP meets and considers the resolution.

Motion passed unanimously.

Councilman Hoffman said AVCP will meet next on January 4, 1971 at St. Marys.

Motion passed unanimously.

Resolution was read again in full by the Clerk. M/M Murphy/Baxter the resolution on NC and City land exchange be accepted in first reading and advanced to second reading by title only.

Motion passed unanimously.

M/M Baxter, Murphy the resolution on NC/City land exchange be approved in second reading. Motion passed unanimously.

Moravian Land Survey (Zoning) - City Administrator reported that Burton Biss is sending materials on zoning. Biss suggested council accept Moravian zoning with tentative approval and then council procede with zoning in due course of time.

M/M Crow/Murphy that the City express its interest in developing a zoning plan for the City, that the Council's land use committee with the administrator develop a re-commendation as to procedures to council and that we express our tentative approval of the Moravian Church zoning of the Mumtretlek Subdivision.

NEW BUSINESS: VFW Winter Carnival, Don Elliott requested \$1,500.00 donation to defrey costs of sky divers from Fairbanks, the balance of the donation to be applied to prize money.

M/M Hoffman/Baxter that the City donate \$1,500.00 for Bethel Winter Carnival.
