### READING OF MINUTES:

Minutes of March 8, 1976 were read by Campbell.  
M/M Peltola that minutes of March 8, 1976 be accepted as corrected.  
Voice vote, unanimous in favor. Motion passed.

### COMMUNICATIONS:

There was two letter with council packets which we be included in the council minutes.

Campbell read a copy of a letter which was sent to Bruce Crow from Senator Chancy Croft.

M/M Peltola that under Item C, New Business we put Resolution # 168, a resolution in support of Senate Bill 585.

Bethel Native Corporation wants City to put out 4 sights for dumping areas, soon and it has to go through BLM to be approved.
