Nicori - Roads and Public Works asked about sno-machine trails.

M/M Crow that the marking of the sno-machine trails be placed under the Public
Safety Committee.

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COMMITTEE REPORTS CONTINUED

Crow - Land Use - Met last Friday October 18, 1974. Committee recommended that the City of Bethel go ahead and sell the lot to Joe Paul at 15¢ a square foot, with the condition that he has two years to build. Second condition was that the City has first option to buy the property back at 15¢ a square foot plus improvements.

Gregory - Recreation - No one came to the last meeting. There was no public enthusiasm this year so there will not be a carnival.

Gregory - Street lights out by the skating pond by Swansons, by Guinns and by Hoffman's Fuel garage.

Murphy - Spoke about the State Elections, Fire protection at the airport in one of the bond issues.

OLD BUSINESS

M/M Crow that we discontinue membership in the Alaska Municipal League. Voice vote, unanimous in favor. motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

The new council members, Edward Hoffman Sr., Darrel Connick, Ruth Richardson and Joe Andrew, Sr. were sworn into office by the City Manager. The oath of office was signed by each.

Nominations were opened for Mayor. Eddy Hoffman and Sarge Connick were nominated.

M/M Murphy that the nominations be closed. Voice vote, unanimous in favor. motion passed.

The mayor was elected by secret ballot, Hoffman 4, Connick 3.

The appointment of Committee members is to be placed on the next agenda.

Item D. Transfer of taxicab permits from Hagen to Cilletti. Edge read the bill of sale. The bill of sale was notarized by William B. Zahradnick on October 2, 1974, bill of sale was signed on June 26, 1974.

M/M Connick that the permits now held by Hagen be transferred to Cilletti. Roll call vote, unanimous in favor. motion passed.



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NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED

Letter from Lena Andree was read concerning the Rap Center and why it is not functioning in a better method.

Tom Anderson replied to this, saying that it was a matter of funding. Mr. Anderson suggested that a member of the Council attend the next board meeting that is scheduled for Wednesday the 30th of October. The City Manager will attend this board meeting as a representative of the Council.

Item F. The Cadet program was discussed.

M/M Connick that the one present cadet be paid \$25.00 a month retroactively from the first of the fiscal year to present and that the funds for this is to come out of the Police Budget.
Roll call vote, unanimous in favor. motion passed.

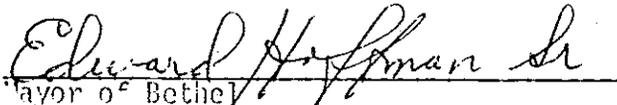
Item G. House fire at Hooper Bay.

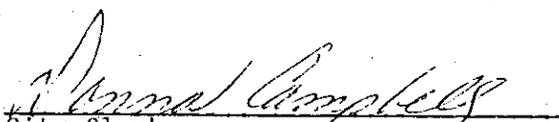
M/M Connick that the City of Bethel donate \$100.00 to the Julius Green family of Hooper bay.
