A RESOLUTION BY THE BETHEL CITY COUNCIL TO ACCEPT A \$603 GRANT AWARD FROM THE FIRST RESPONDER INSTITUTE

WHEREAS, the Glaxo Smith Kline Company established a grant fund whereby ten cents from the sale of every bottle of TUMS would go to fund small and rural fire department purchases up to \$2,500;

WHEREAS, the First Responder Institute administers the First Responder Institute Grant Program (TUMS Grant) on behalf of Glaxo Smith Kline;


WHEREAS, the City of Bethel submitted a grant application to the First Responder Institute in December 2004 and was awarded a grant for \$603.41 in January 2005;

WHEREAS, proceeds from the grant will help the Bethel Fire Department purchase batteries for firefighting equipment, flashlight bulbs, and O-rings for radio headsets;

WHEREAS, ambulance service revenue constitutes the City's intended 50% match from non-taxable sources and this money will come from the FY 2004-2005 fire department budget;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Bethel City Council accepts the grant award of \$603.41 from the First Responder Institute to cover half of the intended purchase cost of firefighting equipment, flashlight bulbs, and O-rings for radio headsets.
