IV. PEOPLE TO BE HEARD

Ana Hoffman- Spoke in opposition to the Council's amendment of Ordinance 13-22, removing the .5% on top of the \$600 for each \$100,000 of the construction permit cost. Commercial businesses within Bethel provide the City with millions of dollars of sales tax revenue. The cost of operating business within the community is expensive; the City should support the flat rate of \$600 to benefit the business owners.

Ross Boring- Spoke to the Council about gun safety and the current issue with access to the Community Gun Range.

Traci Fredericks – Addressed the Council regarding the letters submitted by her father in the packet and the request of a free service line connecting her home to the main city line.

Jennifer Dobson – Spoke in opposition to the tobacco tax being used towards the dog park and indicated that the money’s intent was to focus on the youth of our community. Spoke on behalf of Brian Lefferts, who would like the Administration to consider a walking path from Pinky’s Park to the Tundra Ridge Subdivision. Additionally Brian Lefferts indicated the City Council may want to consider other methods for road maintenance to help keep the dust down which may be less expensive options to current methods which may be assisted by grant funding such as chip seal.

Leif Albertson – Informed the Council that the status of the softball field is still not adequate for the communities use.

Alissa Joseph, Department of Fish and Game-Provided notice to the Council of the filing deadline for comments on the Alaska Department of Fish and Game proposed changes.

Dan Leinberger- Spoke in opposition to the amendments made by the council on Ordinance 13-22, specifically addressing the permit changes to the Site Plan Application Commercial. Suggested the Council leave the fee structure at a flat \$600.

Dave Trantham Jr. – Informed the Council that DOT Plan B is still being considered. They would like to acquire 150 acres of the people land and do not plan on modifying the expansion from West to East.





WHEREAS, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game Joint Board of Fish and Game will meet October 12-16, 2013 to consider a number of regulatory proposals;

WHEREAS, if approved, the proposals will, change the state's local fish and game advisory committees, and subsistence statuses within Bethel;

WHEREAS, according to the Alaska Administrative Code, in applying a subsistence law, the Board of Fisheries and the Board of Game provide for conservation and development of Alaska's fish and game resources according to sustained yield principles;

Whereas , according to Alaska Administrative Code: "a nonsubsistence area is an area or community where dependence upon subsistence is not a principal characteristic of the economy, culture, and way of life of the area of community." 5 AAC 99.016 (a);

Whereas, according to the Alaska Administrative Code : "Subsistence hunting and fishing regulations will not be adopted for these areas and the subsistence priority does not apply." 5 AAC 99.016 (c);

Whereas, in Bethel dependence upon Subsistence is a principle CHARACTERISTIC OF the economy, culture, and way of life;

WHEREAS, the Bethel City Council strongly opposes Proposition 41, changing Bethel's status from a subsistence area to a non subsistence area;

WHEREAS, to determine if a community should be considered a non-subsistence area, the board must consider a number of items surrounding fish stocks, game populations, or portions of stocks or populations, that are customarily and traditionally taken or used by Alaska residents for subsistence uses;

Whereas, the customary and traditional harvest of fish, waterfowl, and game is of paramount importance to the people of Bethel and the surrounding region;

WHEREAS, the Native residents of Bethel ancestors have lived in the region for thousands of years, living a subsistence lifestyle and relying on natural resources to survive;

WHEREAS, the residents of Bethel, both native and non-native, have for over four generations established a consistent reliance on the fish stock and game population, as well as followed traditional methods of processing the catches to allow for year round use of the harvest;

WHEREAS, traditional hunting and fishing values are being passed down from generation to generation so the younger generations will be responsible with their harvest and preserve their subsistence catches while provide for their families;

WHEREAS, Bethel community members responsibly utilize their harvest and catch in every possible way;

WHEREAS, the income per capita within the Bethel census district, is one of the lowest in the State and the residents of Bethel depend on subsistence harvests;

WHEREAS, the conservation of game animals, waterfowl, and fish is extremely important to the Bethel subsistence community,

Whereas, creation of a nonsubsistence area in Bethel would create hardship for the people of Bethel;

Whereas, creation of a nonsubsistence area would be create a cultural disconnect for the people of Bethel;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Bethel City Council strongly opposes Proposal #41, the creation of the Bethel Nonsubsistence area and that the Bethel City Council Supports the customary and traditional use of fish and game by the people of Bethel and the surrounding areas.

CITY OF BETHEL PRIORITIES FOR THE FY 2015 STATE OF ALASKA CAPITAL BUDGET

WHEREAS, the Bethel City Council is a seven-member body elected by resident voters of Bethel to act in the best interest of the community and intends to exhibit transparency, oversight, and accountability for all funds awarded through this request;

WHEREAS, the priorities established herein are rank-ordered and vital to the well-being of the community and municipality of Bethel;

WHEREAS, a summary of the City of Bethel's priorities and requested funding amounts are listed in the following table:

#1	Sewage Lagoon Rehabilitation and Dredge	\$12,000,000
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WHEREAS, the City of Bethel provides hauled sewage service to 1,297 buildings and piped sewage service to 448 buildings;

WHEREAS, all sewage is deposited into the City's sewer lagoon, which is divided into two cells that occupy 61.7 acres;

WHEREAS, the lagoon capacity and simple technological design of using earthen berms without liners and two curtains to filter particles by size are no longer adequate for a community the size of Bethel;

WHEREAS, the City is given an administrative extension from the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation each year to discharge effluent into the Kuskokwim River with the understanding that the City is actively pursuing lagoon remediation efforts;

WHEREAS, the City must discharge 220 million gallons of raw effluent into the Kuskokwim River every year in order to lower lagoon volume and avoid a cataclysmic breach or overflow situation;

WHEREAS, the fact that a portion of the upper lagoon cell wall breached in 2005, causing the discharge of thousands of gallons of effluent onto open tundra, underscores the need for rehabilitation;

WHEREAS, professional engineering firm, Larsen Consulting Group, LLC , completed a preliminary engineering report in 2010 in which they described the poor condition of the lagoon and made recommendations for improvement;

WHEREAS, recommendations from Larsen Consulting comprise the majority of this project: construction of a new third 30-acre holding cell, construction of a 20-acre treatment area, purchase a dredge to remove sludge from the bottom of the lagoon and increase capacity, use of 80 geobags to contain the sludge removed from the lagoon and help it dewater and decompose, replacement of curtains, and complete overhaul of the sewer truck discharge area;

WHEREAS, potential fines up to \$25,000/day could be levied by the Department of Environmental Conservation if remediation efforts are not undertaken immediately;

FY 2015 State Capital Priorities
Notes

1. Sewage Lagoon Rehabilitation and Dredge - This project was the number one priority for the City of Bethel in its FY 2014 State Capital requests. Every year, the sewage lagoon fills with more solids and therefore less water proportionally, causing the lagoon cells to function less effectively. The lagoon rehabilitation was conceived by Larsen Consulting Group and has yet to be fully designed. The City anticipates going out to bid for a design/build lagoon rehabilitation project and the purchase of a new dredge. The dredge would help the City pump out solids, store them in geobags for 1-2 years, and then use the material as fill at the landfill. The dredge would also be used by the Port to perform maintenance dredging of the Small Boat Harbor.

2. Alternate Road Around H-Marker Lake – If funded, the City of Bethel would design, survey, and plan a road from Gunder’s Way near H-Marker Lake to Ptarmigan Street. The preliminary plan calls for the road to cross BNC land and Charles’ family land. Easements would have to be acquired from at least these two landowners. This alternative route around the lake would facilitate vehicle traffic to Tundra Ridge Subdivision and Ptarmigan Street neighborhoods from State Highway and allow access going south to the airport, Kasayulie, Larsen, and downtown.

3. Dust Control Measures, Gravel & Calcium Chloride – The City of Bethel will purchase gravel, calcium chloride, and hydroseed mixture to apply to roads in subdivisions that do not often receive such treatment.

4. Institutional Corridor, Final Phase – The City was awarded \$7,000,000 in FY 2014 State Capital grant funds for the institutional corridor project. The City is working with engineers to design the first phase of the project that will run piped water from the City Subdivision Water Treatment Plant to major institutional users on Chief Eddie Hoffman Highway. The first phase will also include the drilling and capping of a second wall inside the City Sub Water Treatment Plant. The Final Phase of the project will run more water pipe to institutions along the highway not connected in the first phase.

5. City Dock Repair - The City of Bethel received a grant from the Denali Commission in the amount of \$200,000 to design the replacement of the East Timber Wall on Brown’s Slough. The City contributed \$50,000 toward the design project. The East Timber Wall is being jacked out of the ground as it slowly rots and collapses. PND Engineers recommends the removal of the wall and replacing it with a new steel sheet pile wall that will not decay like the timber wall.

6. Port Office Facility – The existing Port Office is a small 12’ x 18’ building with no interior walls and shortage of space for private conversations with staff, customers, contractors, and agency personnel like the U.S. Coast Guard and Corps of Engineers. The proposed new Port Office would be at least 1,200 sq. ft. in size can cost at least \$300,000 to construct at \$250/sq. ft. Three private offices would serve the Port Director, Dock Operator, and Administrative Assistant. A meeting

room would serve the Port Commission, Corps of Engineers, engineering firms, and others who need room for several individuals and space to display large plan sets.

7. Animal Control Facility – This is the City’s second year requesting funds from the State for the construction of a new animal control facility. The current facility is located in a building not designed to serve as an animal shelter and is rife with physical features that cause maintenance headaches every year.

The new facility would be located on the police department property, inside the perimeter security fence. Police Department personnel would continue to be responsible for animal control activities and care and operation of the animal facility.

8. Wireless Equipment and Installation –The City of Bethel is about to enter into a contract with GCI to provide CAT6 or CAT5e wiring, as appropriate, to various City buildings, including City Hall, Fire Station, City Shop, and several smaller Public Works buildings. The City purchased and received new IP telephones that will be installed soon. The City is paying for these IT equipment and service purchases over time in a lease arrangement approved by City Council. The purchase and installation of wireless equipment was not part of the GCI lease arrangement and is not currently funded by the City.

9. New Water Truck – The City of Bethel will be in the hauled water business for the foreseeable future and will always need new water delivery trucks. Most of the City’s water trucks are Sterling-Western makes, a company that is no longer in business. The City believes Mack trucks may be superior in quality and durability and would like to move to a Mack fleet. The City plans to buy a 4,000-gallon tank and larger pump so that more work can be completed faster.

10. New Sewer Truck – The City of Bethel will be in the hauled sewer business for the foreseeable future and will always need new sewer evacuation trucks. These trucks have pump systems that are more complex than the water trucks and usually undergo most costly repairs. Most of the City’s sewer trucks are Sterling-Western, a company that is no longer in business. The City believes Mack trucks may be superior in quality and durability and would like to move to a Mack fleet. The City plans to purchase a 4,000-gallon sewer truck with a stronger pump so that more work can be completed faster.

11. GIS & Mapping Software Upgrade – This item was removed from the list originally presented to the Bethel City Council because further research revealed that the Planning Department currently uses ARC 10, a state-of-the-art GIS and mapping software and Google Earth, free global mapping software. The Planning Department currently has no capital project needs.

12. Bridge to Access Russian Orthodox Cemetery – The City proposes to purchase one pre-fabricated steel bridge, ship it to Bethel by barge, and place it over the creek along the path leading to the cemetery. The City will install the bridge to assure that pedestrians have safe passage over the creek. No other trail improvements are planned.

What's Happening?





By the end of September, there are up to 30 workers on site each day including concrete finishers, electricians, plumbers, masons, roofers and of course the pool crew.

Date: October 1, 2013

A request came in for a Conditional Use Permit for an 80-foot telecommunications tower. It was scheduled for the September 12th Planning Commission meeting and approved, however the property owners have cancelled and GCI is still interested in finding a location.

Surveying continues on some city properties into the month of October.

Site Plan Permit Applications and Code Enforcement: The Planning Department has issued sixty Site Plan Permits to date.

There are still a couple of junk cars to remove but this is mainly under control, with a target of getting cars out of the right of way before it snows.

For the year beginning August 2012, there were 36 code compliance complaints logged at the Planning Department. (In some cases more than one resident may have complained about the same issue.) Twenty-three were residential, often related to lack of city services on the property. Six cases were commercial, and seven related to vehicles. Most of them are resolved, however staff is still working on municipal code revisions, and looking at methods to address severely blighted properties. Staff often have difficulties identifying and contacting property owners, and may spend some time pursuing contacts.

Construction Projects:

Swimming Pool: The project is starting to look like a recreational facility. It is very exciting to go and see the building exterior being completed.

Prematernal Home and Long Term Care Facility: Siding and roofing are being constructed for the Prematernal Home. The Long Term Care Facility is almost complete and an open house was held on September 27, 2013.

Yuut Elitnaurviat Dormitory: The structure is more or less complete. Ribbon cutting occurred on September 27th also.

Kipusvik Shopping Center: Girders are being put in place and exterior siding is going up.

Youth Detention Facility: the State of Alaska is planning an expansion of this facility. The former Receiving Home has been moved to an alternate location to be used as hospital dorm space, and the state has requested a lot line adjustment to expand the present location of their facility.

AC Store: The AC Store is planning to create a taxi lane to better control parking in the front of the store.

Opportunities: There may be a grant available to move a family in a flood prone home to a new home. If anyone can identify an appropriate property, possibly by the Slough, let the Planner know.

Homeland Security Grant Award

The City of Bethel was awarded a State Homeland Security Grant in the amount of \$50,200 for the purchase of four security gates for the Port of Bethel to protect the seawall and embankment and for the Fire Department to purchase two ventilation fans used in fire suppression.

Community Development Block Grant Ideas

The City is exploring projects that will qualify for community development block grant funding. There is \$2 million dollars available this year statewide. The maximum amount of funding that can be requested is \$850,000. A 25% match is required. The funds from this grant must benefit individuals in the low-to-moderate income bracket or specific groups of individuals presumed to be in that bracket (e.g., homeless, illiterate). Three Bethel projects have been funded with CDBGs in the past: Senior Center improvements, Owl Park playground equipment, and Tundra Women’s Coalition building construction.

City Priorities for State Capital Requests

I prepared the resolution for Council consideration with eleven funding ideas. Projects typically have a better chance of funding if they markedly improve health and safety, include funding from other sources, show community collaboration, and result in a completed facility ready to operate. The State is one of the best funding sources because there is no limit on the amount that can be requested; match is not required, but might help funding approval; grant reports are relatively easy to complete, and reimbursements are timely.

The recruits attend classes evenings and Saturday and Sunday except for one weekend per month.

Alisha Chaglauk, from Toksook Bay, has completed her final testing and will begin her career as a police officer here in Bethel within the following weeks. Alisha put herself through the criminal justice program and graduated the last police academy in Fairbanks. We look forward to having Alisha on board and thank Nichole who assisted us in the final interview and testing process in addition to her school duties since Alisha was in Fairbanks.

We still have an open officer position which we have two candidates for this position, one in the testing phase and one CSP opening.

Officer Cox is set for the refresher academy located at Sitka in January.

Operations (Patrol / Communications):

We are still awaiting final completion of Salmonberry and will hopefully have another open house when the contractor and other remaining items are completed.

During this reported period the Bethel Police Department Dispatch Center (Communications) logged 848 calls for service for BPD of which 108 required case reports, of those 68 (76%) were closed by arrest or other means. 44 adult arrests with 1 juvenile arrests.




