

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

  - Nearly half (49.4%) of the sample experienced one form of family violence during childhood
  - **Individuals who witnessed animal cruelty were 8.14 times more likely to be perpetrators**

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### Research

- 2009 Study (cont.) – General Findings
  - Witnessing animal cruelty was the biggest predictor of later violence by the witness
  - Witnessing animal cruelty with child abuse or exposure to domestic violence increases the risk of animal cruelty
  - Exposed individuals to severe domestic violence were more likely to have witnessed animal abuse
  - Animal abuse was also associated with higher rates of child neglect

Then the dog bit at his 11-year-old son.

"I took it out on the dog," Fleet, 34, told a Philadelphia judge Friday, an understatement considering that he set the five-month-old pit bull mix on fire in front of his children.

Fleet pleaded no contest to animal cruelty, child endangerment, and corrupting a minor, and learned that he had accomplished just what he had been fighting to avoid: He lost his children.

  - 22.8% of shelter women delayed leaving home due to concerns of the pets

**TAHLEQUAH** — Charges have been filed against a Rose man accused of beating a woman and child with a whip and brass handle and forcing that same child to watch as he decapitated a puppy with an ax.

Brandon Keith Hubbard, 28, faces felony counts of child abuse by injury and cruelty to animals and a misdemeanor count of domestic assault and battery in the presence of children.

Investigators with the District Attorney's Office said they received information in late June that an 8-year-old girl had been beaten with a whip and brass handle. While the girl was being whipped with the brass stick during one incident, a brake, according to an affidavit filed in the case.

Investigators say they see "severe bruising" on the girl, and also took 32 photographs showing injuries allegedly inflicted by Hubbard on an adult woman.

It was not clear Monday who had custody of the child.

In a case that the prosecutor called "outright depravity," a police officer from Moorestown, N.J. and his former girlfriend were convicted on 22 counts for repeatedly sexually assaulting three girls and a boy between the ages of 12 and 17 over an eight-year period and videotaping some of the attacks. Robert Mela, 42, and Heather Lewis, 36, are scheduled for sentencing in Superior Court on Sept. 13, where each could face more than 50 years in prison. Investigators also found videos of the policeman engaged in sex with calves on a farm, but a judge dismissed those charges saying there was no evidence that the animals had been "tormented" by the acts.

Dear Mayor Klejka, Vice Mayor Peltola, and Distinguished Council Members:

It is with a great sense of accomplishment that I present the Proposed Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 2014 for the City of Bethel for your consideration. I'm especially pleased because this is the fourth consecutive year that a balanced budget with a modest surplus has been delivered. This budget is submitted in accordance with Bethel Municipal Code section 4.04.020 and Alaska State Statutes. I believe it appropriately and reasonably addresses the goals and objectives of our municipal government for the upcoming year to the best of our ability.

This proposed budget has been prepared with a focus on remaining fiscally conservative while adequately addressing the requirements for necessary services to meet the needs of our community. Section 4.04.055 of Chapter 4 of the Bethel Municipal Code (BMC) mandates that the City achieve a balanced annual budget. This proposed budget satisfies that goal with a remaining General Fund surplus of \$108,939.

A major component in the development of the annual budget is to accurately project City revenues. To remain conservative in our approach, it was my decision to exclude potential revenue from the recently passed tobacco tax because the first returns are not due until the end of April. Perhaps the "best practice" approach would be for Council to add the tobacco tax revenue after the first returns have been received and a more accurate projection can be provided.

With rising operational costs due mainly to inflation, and the absence of any rate increase in the upcoming year, the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund again requires a subsidy from the General Fund to meet its expenses. The amount of this subsidy for FY 2014 is projected at \$643,350. However, it is expected that the new water and sewer subscription fees established by City Council will generate \$196,000 in the forthcoming year which will be set aside for capital improvements and depreciation and will not be used toward covering the cost of annual operations.

In addition to the transfer to the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund, a transfer to the Leased Properties Enterprise Fund is necessary to break even on operations in the amount of \$25,570 excluding depreciation. The Administration is in the early stages of renegotiating the terms of two of the leases in the Courthouse, which we hope can be presented to City Council for approval in the near future. We expect to be able to provide some increased revenues to help offset the rising costs of operations but did not include any additional revenue in the FY 2014 Budget because those revenue increases remain undetermined at this time.

Included in the proposed budget were certain capital expenditures and improvements as follows:

- \$25,000 for upgrades to our computer servers which represents phase one of a three phase upgrade
- \$6,800 for an upgrade to the Caselle accounting system which will enable department heads to more effectively and efficiently manage their budgets
- \$30,000 to be transferred to the Park Development Capital Project Fund for City Park Development
- \$14,000 for a burner control upgrade to Courthouse equipment in an attempt to improve efficiency and lower energy costs
- \$50,000 transfer from the Port Enterprise Fund to the Port Office Capital Project Fund for future construction of a new Port office facility
- \$300,000 from the Fleet Replacement Fund for a new Sewer truck
- \$30,000 for new pickup truck for the Port
- \$643,076 to be transferred to the Yukon Kuskokwim Regional Health and Aquatic Safety Center Capital Project Fund from designated sales tax revenues.

Personnel costs are always a primary concern in any fiscal year. This year, the only additional personnel requested are in two departments. To meet the increasing demand upon our Police force, I am requesting two additional sworn officers be added to the department. I believe the addition of these officers will enable us to better address the needs of our community, make Bethel an even safer place to live, and reduce overtime costs. I am also recommending the addition of an exempt salaried Assistant Police Chief while defunding the Investigative Administrative Sergeant position. I believe making this adjustment will further strengthen the management team of the Police Department.

I'm also requesting that the Recycling Center, with one full-time employee, be included in the budget. Much has been said about the need to again have a recycling center in our community and I believe we have the funds to do so now. Adding recycling back to our Solid Waste Enterprise Fund budget can be done while keeping a surplus budget. In the future, additional revenues can also be expected from recycling activities, which will further strengthen the financial position of this fund.

In conclusion, I have been abundantly pleased with how our Department Heads have worked selflessly with me to meet the Administration's budget goals. I look forward to working with City Council to finalize our annual budget for Fiscal Year 2014.

#### **AN ORDINANCE BY THE BETHEL CITY COUNCIL AMENDING TITLE 7 ELECTIONS SECTION 7.30.050 REMOVING THE ALASKA PUBLIC OFFICES COMMISSION FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE REQUIRMENTS AND INSERTING THE BETHEL MUNICIPAL CODE FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENT**

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED** by the City Council of Bethel Alaska as follows:

**SECTION 1. Classification.** This ordinance is of permanent nature and shall be codified within the Bethel Municipal Code.

**SECTION 2.** Bethel Municipal Code Title 7 Election Section 7.30.050 is amended as follows: new language is underlined and old language is stricken.

#### **7.30 Candidate Qualifications**

7.30.010 Candidate qualifications.

Any person is eligible for city office if the person is a qualified voter of the state and a resident of the city for at least one (1) year immediately preceding filing for office.

7.30.020 Declaration of candidacy.

A. A person who seeks to be a candidate for city council shall execute and file a declaration of candidacy with the clerk in accordance with this section. The declaration shall be executed under oath before an officer authorized to take acknowledgments.

B. A declaration of candidacy shall be on a form provided by the clerk and shall state the following:

1. The full name of the candidate, and the manner in which he wishes his name to appear on the ballot;
2. The full residence and mailing address of the candidate;
3. The day and evening telephone numbers of the candidate;
4. The office for which the candidate declares;
5. That the candidate is qualified for the office as provided by law;
6. That the candidate is a resident of the city;
7. That the candidate meets, or shall meet, as required by law, the specific requirements of the office the candidate is seeking;

8. The date and notarized statement signed by the candidate;

9. A certification by the candidate that the information in the declaration of candidacy is true and accurate.

C. Declarations of candidacy shall be provided by the clerk not earlier than seven (7) days prior to the opening of the filing period. Declarations of candidacy shall be submitted in original form and shall not be submitted by facsimile.

D. Filing for city office shall be made by filing a declaration of candidacy with the city clerk from 8:00 a.m., August fifth (5th) through 4:00 p.m., August twentieth (20th). In the event August 20th falls on Saturday Sunday or legal holiday, the candidate shall have until noon the next business day that is not a sat sun or legal holiday to file their declaration of candidacy.

E. Within four (4) business days after the filing of a declaration of candidacy, the clerk shall notify the candidate named in the declaration of candidacy whether or not it is in proper form. If not, the clerk shall immediately return it with a statement certifying wherein the declaration of candidacy is deficient to the candidate. A new declaration of candidacy for the same candidate may be filed within the time for filing declarations of candidacy.

#### 7.30.030 Write-in candidates.

In addition to the limitations contained in BMC 7.60.020, votes for a write-in candidate will not be counted unless that candidate has filed a declaration of candidacy with the clerk. A declaration of candidacy filed under this section must be filed with the clerk not earlier than the day immediately following the last day of the filing period and not later than 5:00 p.m. five days prior to the election.

#### 7.30.040 Notice of vacancies in office.

At least three (3) calendar days before the declaration of candidacy period is open for each regular or special election, the clerk shall post in three (3) public places a notice of offices to be filled at the election and the manner of filing a declaration of candidacy.

#### 7.30.050 Conflict of interest statements.

A. Candidates for elective city office and declared write-in candidates shall file an ~~Alaskan Public Offices Commission Conflict of Interest Statement with the clerk as required by the provisions of AS 39.50 at the time of:~~ Financial Disclosure Statement with the city clerk as required by the provisions of BMC 2.05.080 at the time of:

1. Filing a declaration of candidacy. The clerk shall place the name of the candidate on the ballot only after the candidate has complied with this requirement.

2. Declaring their candidacy as a write-in candidate.

B. Each candidate for an elective office shall file the name and address of the candidate's campaign treasurer with the Alaska Public Offices Commission no later than seven (7) days after the date of filing a declaration of candidacy.

#### 7.30.060 Corrections, amendments and withdrawal of declarations of candidacy.

Any candidate may withdraw his nomination at any time during the period of filing a declaration of candidacy by written notice to the clerk. After the filing period has closed, no declaration of candidacy may be corrected, amended or withdrawn.

#### 7.30.070 Determination of candidate eligibility.

- A. The clerk shall determine whether each candidate filing a declaration of candidacy for municipal office is qualified as provided by law. At any time before the election the clerk may disqualify any candidate whom the clerk finds is not qualified.
- B. Any person, including the clerk, may question the eligibility of a candidate who has filed a declaration of candidacy by filing a complaint with the clerk.
- C. The complaint must be in writing and include the name, mailing address, contact phone number, signature of the person making the complaint, and a statement describing the grounds on which the candidate's eligibility is being questioned.
- D. The clerk will review only those issues in the complaint related to candidate eligibility.
- E. Upon receipt of a complaint, or if the clerk questions the eligibility of the candidate, the clerk will send notification in writing to the candidate.
- F. The clerk shall review any evidence relevant to the candidate's qualifications, including, but not limited to, the candidate's residency, voter registration, declaration of candidacy, and any other document of public record or as required by BMC 7.30.010. Based on the review of the documents, the clerk will determine whether a preponderance of evidence supports or does not support the eligibility of the candidate.
- G. If the clerk determines the preponderance of evidence supports the eligibility of the candidate, the clerk will issue a final determination supporting the candidate's eligibility.
- H. If the clerk determines the preponderance of evidence does not support the candidate's eligibility, notice to the candidate will identify any additional information or evidence that must be provided by the candidate. The clerk must receive the requested information no later than three business days from the date of notice. The clerk will consider any additional information provided and issue a final determination as to the candidate's eligibility no later than three business days from receipt of the additional information.
- I. If the information requested by the clerk in subsection H of this section is not received by the specified deadline, the clerk will issue a final determination regarding the candidate's eligibility based on the information initially reviewed.
- J. The clerk will send notice of final determination in writing to the person making the complaint if applicable, and to the candidate. The determination of the clerk shall stand.

7.30.080 Prohibitions.

A. No elected official of the city may hold any other compensated city office or city employment, or elected position in the state or federal government while in office.

B. A public safety volunteer is exempt from this section per BMC 3.64.060.

**Section 4: Preclearance:** Upon approval of this ordinance by the City Council, the City Clerk shall prepare and submit this ordinance for preclearance by the United States Department of Justice pursuant to Section 5 of the Federal Voting Rights Act.

**Section 5: Effective Date:** This ordinance shall become effective upon preclearance from the U.S. Department of Justice, or sixty (60) days following submission of the preclearance request authorized by Section 3 of this ordinance if no objection is interposed pursuant to 28 C.F.R. § 51.42.



Dear Mayor Klejka and Distinguished Bethel City Council Members:

Thank you for your strong interest in the Bethel Airport Master Plan currently underway within the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) Central Region. The Bethel Airport is a critical lifeline for local residents and the entire Yukon Kuskokwim Region. As such, we intend to work closely with you and myriad other stakeholders to get the master plan right.

Successful airport master planning occurs when a prescribed process is both respected and followed. We are following the FAA's airport master planning guidelines for the Bethel Airport because we're using federal funds to accomplish the work. Master planning under FAA guidelines is mandated to be transparent and public, while thoroughly considering multiple courses of action for potential projects. Discerning the best course of action to meet projected needs depends on air traffic projections, airport user needs, land acquisition and use constraints, potential environmental concerns, project cost-benefit analysis, and community impacts.

We are currently in the early stages of developing an updated master plan and are seeking comments on potential long term capital improvements. As we respect process we must be careful about rejecting any options ahead of the full and deep analysis of all options at this stage of plan development. The location of a future crosswind runway at Bethel Airport is a good example where process demands deeper analysis of all options, along with further user, community, and FAA coordination.

Balancing your objections articulated in Resolution 13-05 there is yet compelling rationale supporting westward expansion that must, in fairness to all stakeholders be more fully explored and vetted. There is also a no crosswind runway option to consider should FAA determine expansion to either the west or east too expensive. Aircraft operators and air traffic controllers currently do not support the eastward expansion options because they are less efficient for




aircraft and air traffic operations. The eastward options require longer aircraft taxi distances increasing fuel burn and potentially causing delays for aircraft needing to hold for traffic on other runways. In fact, during initial outreach to carriers our consultants found the total effect of the inefficiency associated with the eastward options was so great that some airlines indicated they would be unlikely to use a crosswind runway built to the east, even if one was built. Additionally, because the east side options look to be substantially more expensive, the FAA has indicated reluctance to fund an eastward expansion option pending more compelling cost-benefit justification. No final decisions have been taken specific to the crosswind runway and rest assured we'll work hard to ensure the public process continues to work as it should as choices are made.

With regard to the shooting range, even outside the context of the master plan update, the current location of the shooting range is a concern given its proximity to aircraft traffic. We appreciate the time, effort, benefits, and expense that have gone toward developing this shooting range and we certainly support preserving a community shooting range capability within future airport development efforts. However, we, along with the FAA Airports Division representatives, still see a need to discuss the current location of the shooting range with you further, irrespective of the crosswind runway extension question. There may be alternative locations for the shooting range that would better meet the needs of the Bethel community and would not present chronic conflicts with the needs of this busy and growing hub airport. The State would also likely be able to assist the City with funding and technical support to evaluate and develop alternate locations for the shooting range.

On a positive note, we do believe we have achieved some short term "wins" in the ongoing conversation. Once we learned of the conflicts of the proposed Tower Road relocation with the Alaska Territorial Guard Memorial Park, we revised the location of the road in order to honor, preserve, and protect the Memorial Park. If there are yet better routings options for Tower Road than currently proposed, there is ample time for additional refinement.

In summary, your comments are most welcomed, encouraged, and highly valuable. Also be assured that my staff is available to meet with you and the Council at your convenience as master plan development and public outreach continues. We'll certainly do our part to be accessible and receptive to open and frank communications. Thank you again for providing formal comments.

Listed below are some of the action items and activities that I've been working on, and involved in, for the period April 16 – May 7, 2013.

### CITY ADMINISTRATION ACTION ITEMS AND ACTIVITIES

#### **Projects:**

- **YK Aquatic Center** - Regular weekly teleconference meetings between the Project Management Team and City Administration are held each Friday at 9:00 a.m. The following items are germane:
  1. The piles were inspected by Arctic Foundations and verified to be frozen back; test results are forthcoming from the contractor.
  2. Crews are currently welding pile caps and should be completed with this evolution no later than May 17, 2013.
  3. The site is being cleaned up prior to temporary demob while we await construction materials scheduled to arrive on the first BSI-leased barge.
  4. Beverly Hoffman and her husband were escorted on a visit to the site by ProDev's Mike Nevenzal.
  5. ProDev's Doug Cobb and pool SME (subject matter expert) Cory Wills did a telephonic interview with KYUK in response to questions about the pool.
  6. ProDev and the Administration are reviewing the possibility of grant opportunities with Rasmussen and the Foraker Group that will assist us in obtaining native artwork, furnishing and equipment.
  7. The Administration, ProDev, and the contractor are in discussions about the construction of the required fire access road around the pool facility.

8. The design team is working with Bill Arnold and Cory Willis to develop pool draining policies and procedures.
- **Small Boat Harbor & Brown's Slough Dredging** – The Corps of Engineers project manager signed off on both of these projects as completed. What remains are mounds of dirty ice and snow that will thaw and disappear as temperatures rise.
  - **Public Works Shop Floor** – The demolition of the steel and wood floor on the south side of the building has been completed. Floor replacement materials have been ordered and are expected to arrive on the first Northland Services barge sometime around the first week in June. Change Order #1, approved by me, enabling the contractor to repair the south wall floor supports, an item not specifically addressed in the statement of work.

**Miscellaneous:**

- **Planning/Pre-Planning Grant** – The Administration has been trying for some time to close out this final grant with USDA/RD. On May 2, we received an official letter from Tasha Deardorff at USDA/RD, stating that they will consider May 31, 2013, as the official closeout date for this grant award. Commencing in June, we will be able to once more apply to USDA/RD for grants to assist the City with various projects.
- **Transfer of ASHA Building** – On October 23, 2012, Council, at the Administration's request, passed Ordinance #12-08 authorizing the acquisition by transfer of real property from ASHA to the City. In the ensuing months since the passage of that ordinance, ASHA has reviewed, and subsequently reversed, their decision to transfer the real property to the City. Thus, the property remains in the ASHA inventory and Ordinance #12-08 is null and void.
- **Celebration of Flight** – The City has agreed to be one of the sponsors for this celebration that will be held on May 26 in Bethel. Events include the display of vintage aircraft, a community barbecue, a Meet & Greet for kids to meet pilots, and a traveling museum exhibit commemorating the first flight and important regional aviators in Alaska's history. An evening reception is planned at the cultural center.
- **Citizen Complaint & Response** – Enclosed is a copy of a complaint from Mr. Jaris Michaels about the Bethel Police Department's conduct in responding to a call, and my written response to that complaint subsequent to a thorough review.

## Planning Department Report

**From:** Rachael Pitts, Planning Director

**Date:** May 1, 2013

City staff met with ONC in April to discuss access issues to Lot 13 (USS 4117), the site of a proposed residential subdivision. The site could be accessed from the west by way of Lot 15, a city property. Rod Kinney represented ONC at the meeting, and presented a preliminary site plan for the development. They are still in the site planning and development phase of the project.

City staff also met with a representative of Sea Lion Inc. to address water service topics in the vicinity of the trailer park. More information is needed at this time about the status of the water provider with regards to the State of Alaska regulatory process. Discussion will continue.

Flood Insurance rates will be increasing. If you want more information on this just contact the Planning Department. We are now issuing a Floodplain Development Permit for developers who want to develop in the floodplain. This permit has special requirements. Generally new development is occurring in the west of the city outside of the floodplain. However there are some projects that occur in the port area or near Browns Slough that will have to meet higher standards.

A new scanner / printer was set up for the Planning Department this month. The scanner is being used to digitize important maps, surveys, and other over-sized materials. The equipment can handle widths to 36 inches. The Planner is researching existing documents and scanning them in for preservation.

The Planner provided a training session to some other staff members about legal descriptions and doing research on the State Recorder's website. The training included demystifying plats and surveys, how to read and write legal descriptions, and how to find information about subdivisions.

Site Plan Permit Applications and Code Enforcement: We have issued eleven Site Permits to date.

### Construction Projects:

*Swimming Pool:* The pilings are in as well as pads for the wind turbines. There are also new power poles at the site.


*Prematernal Home and Long Term Care Facility:* Siding and roofing are being constructed.

### **Programs/Divisions**

#### **Public Works Director:**

Salzbrun Services and Drilling Inc. have the contract for the Public Works Shop floor rehabilitation and they have started on the demolition of the rotted out section of the south side. By the end of this week, April 29<sup>th</sup>, they should be done cutting out the floor to be replaced.

Kendall Ford of Wasilla will be bringing the ford pick-ups to Northland Services and they will make the first barge to Bethel as soon as the river ice is out.

75% of the year has elapsed with 78.3% expended

#### **Utility Maintenance:**

This month we responded to seven after hour callouts. We continue to level and thaw pipes in ASHA. We also continue to assist at the New Police Station with holding tank and installing helicoils where needed. We also continue to Blue Tag and turning ON and OFF services according to shutoff list. We also monitor our lift stations daily and rebuild pumps when necessary.

Piped Water: 75% of the year has elapsed with 72.2% expended  
Piped Sewer: 75% of the year has elapsed with 73.9% expended  
Sewer Lagoon: 75% of the year has elapsed with 71.1% expended  
BHWTP: 75% of the year has elapsed with 83.3% expended  
CSWTP: 75% of the year has elapsed with 66% expended

## **Hauled Utilities:**

We have a full roster of drivers now. Attendance needs work. There was a bad flooding at 221 State Highway. Not the drivers fault. The owner had a cheap connecter hooked up to the fill line that came apart. Due to the shop floor construction, water trucks are parking on the V&E and Road Maintenance side of the building. And the sewer trucks are parking outside. Will take some getting used to .Will be starting clean up/green up soon. So there will be plenty to do. Routes are getting done.

Hauled Water: 75% of the year has elapsed with 75.1% expended  
Hauled Sewer: 75% of the year has elapsed with 65.2% expended  
Hauled Refuse: 75% of the year has elapsed with 69.5% expended  
Landfill Operations: 75% of the year has elapsed with 94.8% expended

## **Property Maintenance:**

We are still checking the buildings for heat and plumbing, making adjustments as necessary during this cold spring. The weather is letting us scale back on problem ice patches and areas where the public accesses the buildings. We have installed some new doors in a couple of buildings and replaced hardware on others. I talked to a representative from Johnson Controls to help us with **our** Ventilation Systems at the Court House. This will help bring us up to date on this ageing equipment. We also did some painting in one of the offices for the Judge. Thank you.

## **Road Maintenance:**

Streets and Road has been steaming culverts for the last two weeks with the two steamers we have. So far no roads have washed out yet, but that is due to the cold weather that we been having so far. Due to the cold weather we've had to go back and thaw some of the culverts we've done earlier when they froze up again. This year we have a lot more culverts frozen than last year or in the last few years for that matter.

Streets and Roads have also been running a grader from the afternoons when it starts thawing to the evenings when the road is easier to grade up. On the drier roads we're able to grade those roads and keep those roads

smooth but on the wet muddy roads we can only keep touching them up with the grader until they dry out. With two steamers going we can only keep one grader going most of the time.

Streets and Roads have also been loosing up gravel from the gravel pile at the city shop and the sand pile by the salt sand pile with the Cat Backhoe, this is to help to keep roads up and also for emergencies. Gary and Dave also hauled some of the sand to the land fill on the road that goes to the working face of the land fill. This makes it a little easier for the dumpster truck and the public to get to the working face in the land fill to dump their garbage.

### **Vehicles and Equipment:**

We are concentrating on getting summer tires changed on police vehicles and all other city vehicles at this time. Shane has been on vacation this past week but will be returning soon. John Jordan has also taken a well needed leave of absence for a couple of weeks. Sharon is on emergency leave for a while due to a family emergency but is also expected to be back to work soon. With the snow and ice melting, there hasn't been as many wrecker calls lately as driveways are more visible. Josh and Charles have been staying busy keeping the water and sewer trucks on the road despite being shorthanded for the past week. We have had to adjust a little to our cramped work environment while the shop floor is being demolished on the hauled utilities side of the shop, being that we have to park all the water trucks inside our work bays over night while the temperatures are still freezing during the night.

### **Transit System:**

For the month of April the Bethel Transit System transported a total of 961 passengers. 48 of those riders had disability and approximately 165 were elders. Compared to last year, this shows a decrease of 418 riders, and a decrease of \$1602 in cash fares, however there was 375 monthly passes used.

Ridership is down from last year, and we will try a couple of ideas to see if

we can encourage people to ride the buses.

- A. Put decals (  ) on the sides of the buses, with a listing of the fares. (\$\$\$) Have a free ride day, once a month.
- B. Once a month give a free pass to riders that pay, if they're an adult they'd get a free adult pass, if a youth a youth pass, and if an elder an elder pass, (Projected cost.....\$125-\$150)
- C. We are putting up large laminated posters (8.5X11) in the stores/airlines/ etc....with a space for the current bus routes/fares and will be adding them to the Bus Stop posts around town.
- D. Build bus shelters (4' x 8') for the passengers that don't have access to other facilities to get out of the weather, (\$1100.00 material cost). We need 4-6.
- E. Increase the hours/number of trips the **Green Line** makes. Currently it runs from 6:30am to 9:30 and then from 3:30 to 6:30. We increased the morning so the **Green Line** would run from 6:30am to 11:30am and from 3:30pm to 6:30pm. This will help to fill the gap between 9:30 and 1:00pm. The **red line** runs from 7:00am to 9:00am and from 1:00pm to 4:00pm. Currently the Green Line driver works 8 hours per day; she was spending 2 hours, per day, as the Acting Transit Manager and his is no longer need. We are giving out passenger comment slips, asking them for their suggestions, comments, and ideas as how we can improve the service.

We are replacing the motor in Bus 436 it'll cost about \$14,000. With the new motor the bus should be good for another 50,000 to 75,000 miles. When the bus is ready we'll be starting an Airport Route. At the ONC and City Council joint meeting one of the City Council members said they attended the Chamber of Commerce meeting and several of the Chamber's members were very excited about the possibility of the Bethel Transit System starting an airport bus route. I talked to Gene Peltola, YKHC CEO, and he said that YKHC might be able to subsidize it but not until the Federal Fiscal Year begins, October 1. I've checked with AVCP and they are checking into their Transit Grant. We'll try it for 60-90 days and if it proves to be feasible we'll plan to continue until the end of the fiscal year,

June 30, 2014. We are currently applying to the State (DOT) for a new bus. They, Debbi Howard the State Transit Coordinator, were very encouraging and told us to include it, as an emergency, in our grant application.

Bethel Transit System goal for the FY 2014 will be to show a 20-25 percent increase in ridership / revenue. I think we can do this by providing better serve for our passengers.



### **Programs/Divisions**

- All vehicles are up and running with the exception of the 1972 Engine-2 which still has serious problems with its diesel engine.
- We are in receipt of two proposals to furnish the City with a new fire engine. Our review of them should be completed this week.
- The department continues to work with the City Planning Department and the State Fire Marshal's office with regards to a number of new commercial structures and/or additions being built in Bethel. This has already been a busy construction season.

### **Staffing Issues/Concerns/Training**

- All of the department's Firefighter/EMT positions are filled.
- We are making preparations for breakup and potential flooding. We are in constant contact with the local flood preparation working group.
- The department continues its teaching of a Firefighter I class to five students. Captain Howell is the primary instructor. The training will go until mid June and candidates will get their State Certification after successfully completing the written tests and the practical skills.
- An EMT meeting was held on April 16 in the evening at the Fire Station. A review of recent ambulance runs was conducted followed by training provided by John Erickson of Zoll Medical, the company that makes the new heart monitors we will be using on the ambulances.

- A Fire meeting was held on April 25 in the evening at the Fire Station. A review of recent fire calls was conducted followed by training in fireground operations for using our ground ladders.
- A Fire meeting was held on April 11. Staff and volunteers practiced the use of some of the fire hydrants in town.

### Finance Committee

The Finance Committee did not achieve a quorum at its regularly scheduled meeting on April 15, 2013. The next meeting of the committee is set for May 20<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm.

### Staffing Issues/Concerns/Training

We are excited to announce the hiring of Josephine Stern as General Ledger Accountant/Analyst. Ms. Stern comes to us with a strong academic background in accounting and business. She will be an immediate contributor toward the continued success of the department. There are no other vacancies within the department at this time.

### Budget/Financial

As of February 28, 2013, the Finance Department had expended \$518,552.87 (68.9%) of its annual budget of \$752,617 with 75% of the year elapsed. The Utility Billing Department, which is also managed by the Finance, had expended \$120,845.47 (65.5%) of its annual budget of \$184,514.

### Project Updates

- FY 2014 Annual Budget Preparation  
Budget meetings were conducted throughout April with the ordinance postponed until the May 14<sup>th</sup> council meeting.
- Online Bill Pay and Processing  
Online Bill Pay has been implemented and is already starting to show benefits. We will provide updates about how many customers are utilizing the service as we receive those numbers.
- Office Renovation  
The finance department recently underwent renovations to the front of our office to improve efficiency by creating separation between cash receipting and the accounting offices.

- Fixed Asset Audit

Finance is conducting our biannual review of all the City's fixed assets which is required by the federal government for all recipients of federal awards. This internal audit will begin in early May and should be completed within a few weeks. We will be going to departments to visibly inspect certain assets as determined in the scope of our internal audit. This will help us in preparation for our annual financial statement audit in October.


