Summary Statement

The City of Bethel applied for State Homeland Security Program funds and was awarded a grant in the amount of \$49,141 to cover some or all of the cost to purchase one thermal imager for the Fire Department and the cost to purchase and install fencing around the water tank at one of the City's water treatment plants. There is no match required by the City.

Public Works Director Bill Arnold wants to use the fencing funds to put up an eight-foot high chain link fence around the water tank at the City Subdivision Water Treatment Plant. This is the tank with the most damage caused by vandalism thus far and therefore the one most in need of protection. It is also the easiest fence around tank project to complete.
